### School Board Proceedings.

The Natchitoches Parish School Board met in regular session Tuesday, July 5, 1921, with the following members present: Messrs. Z. T. Gallion, Jr., E. T. Walker, A. L. Messick, C. C. Hattaway, G. L. Berry, T. B. Sellers, J. F. Hawthorn, J. S. Rachal, Sam'l Friedman, M. Barron.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Hattaway and seconded by Mr. Friedman:

Whereas, T. B. Sellers, president of this board, and Z. T. Gallion, Jr., vice-president, acting for and on behalf of this board, did on the 15th day of June, 1921, enter into an agreement in writing with the firm of Mettrick & Law, contractors, of Beaumont, Texas, for the erection of a high school building in School District No. 9 of the Parish of Natchitoches, in accordance with plans and specifications furnished by J. W. Smith, architect, for the price and sum of \$129,268.00, which said contract is of record in the mortgage records of the Parish of Natchitoches in book \_\_\_\_\_, folio \_\_\_\_\_;

Whereas, it is the desire of this board to approve the action of the said president and vice-president in entering into said contract and to ratify the same, now therefore,

Be it resolved by the Natchitoches Parish School Board that the action of T. B. Sellers, president, and J. T. Gallion, Jr., vice-president, in entering into said contract, be and the same is hereby in all things ratified, approved and confirmed, and said contract is hereby made the act and deed of this board.

(Carried.)

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Hattaway and seconded by Mr. Gallion:

That Supt. Hooper be authorized and empowered to issue an acceptance to T. J. Peavy to the amount of \$785 bearing interest at the rate of five per cent, for construction of the Levy and Mora Schools in Ward 8.

(Carried.)

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Berry:

That the board reject the payment of a bill to W. H. Oliver to the amount of \$37.50 for transferring children to the Alpha School.

(Carried.)

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Berry and seconded by Mr. Hattaway:

That the board accept the bid made

by W. C. Stout on the Marthaville auditorium in district No. 5, which reads as follows:

"Jackson, Miss., July 2, 1921. Natchitoches Parish School Board, Natchitoches, La.

Dear Sirs: I will furnish all the different materials and perform all the labor to fully build and complete the auditorium building at Marthaville, La., according to plans and specifications prepared by J. W. Smith, architect, contract to be awarded July 5th, 1921, all for the price and sum of \$28,496.

I have allowed, in making this estimate, 15 per cent for the difference in the cash value and the par value of the bonds. If the owners sell the bonds and pay cash, 80 per cent, between the 1st and 10th of each month as the work progresses on your certificate, shall be paid to me, and you will please deduct 15 per cent from my bid.

If the owners see fit to adopt an A-1 personal bond instead of a guarantee bond as specified, deduct 15 per cent from my bid.

PROCESS VERBAL OF CANVASS OF RETURNS

Be it known and remembered, that on this 6th day of July, 1921, at 11 o'clock a. m., in accordance with an ordinance of the Parish School Board of Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana, enacted on the 16th day of May, 1921, notice of which was issued and published according to law, the undersigned members of the Natchitoches Parish School Board of Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana, being a quorum thereof, met in public session at the office of said board in said parish, and according to law, opened the ballot boxes used in, and which were received from the commissioners of, the election held on Saturday, the 2nd day of July, 1921, and there proceeded to count the ballots both in number and amount, for and against, to determine the proposition to levy a two mill (\$.002) special tax on all the property subject to taxation in School District No. 2, Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, annually, for a period of two years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

The result of the said count was eight ballots and \$32944.00 in favor of said proposition, and no ballots and no dollars against said proposition, and therefore, the majority in both number and amount cast by the property taxpayers of the said school district No. 2 in the parish of Natchitoches in said election being in favor thereof; and,

At the same time and place we did examine and canvass the returns as evidenced by the duplicate tally sheets and duplicate compiled statement, the correctness of both being sworn to by the commissioners, according to law, and finding also that the returns indicated a majority both in number and amount of property in favor of said proposition.

Therefore, we declare that the result of the said election is in favor of the Proposition to levy a two mill (\$.002) special tax on all the property subject to taxation in School District No. 2, Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, annually, for a period of two years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

And in accordance with law, a promulgation of the aforesaid result was prepared, and the Secretary of the Natchitoches Parish School Board was ordered to have a copy of the same, signed by the president, published in one issue of the official journal.

And likewise we did order that one copy of this process verbal be sent to the Secretary of State to be recorded in the archives of the State of Louisiana; that one copy be sent to the recorder of Mortgages to be recorded in the mortgage records; and that one copy be kept in the records of said school board.

This done and signed in the presence of R. A. Wagley, T. A. Roberson and T. B. Middleton, competent witnesses and electors, on this 5th day of July, 1921, at the office of the Parish School Board of Natchitoches Parish, by the undersigned members of the Parish School Board of said parish, present and participating in the canvass of the said election:
