#### Police Jury Proceedings

Special Meeting Police Jury, Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, Monday, October 31, 1921.

The Hon. Police Jury in Special Session convened with President Airey presiding and all members present except Mr. Phillips.

Being the time set for the opening of bids for the sale of bonds for Road Districts 13, Ward 2; 26, Ward 2; 27, Ward 19, all of the Parish of Natchitoches, La.

That there was on file the following bids:  
For Road District No. 13, one bid, that of Weaver Brothers of Mora, La.  
For Road District No. 26, Ward 2, that of M. W. Elkins and Co. and L. E. French and Co. (joint bid).  
For Road District No. 27, Ward 10, that of L. E. French and Co. of Alexandria, La.

The notice inviting these bids were thereupon read and the bids opened and read in open session, in accordance with same.

By Mr. Lacaze, seconded by Mr. Airey:  
That a committee be appointed to go over these bids carefully and report its findings to the Police Jury.  
Committee: Dr. Joyner, Messrs. Page, Friedman, Lacaze, and Airey. (Carried unanimously.)

Report from Committee:  
By Mr. Airey, seconded by Mr. Friedman:  
We, your committee, request that Police Jury reject the bids submitted for the sale of the bonds of Road District No. 26 and Road District No. 27. (Carried unanimously.)

By Mr. Friedman, seconded by Mr. Lacaze:  
That the following bid of Weaver Brothers for the bonds of Road District No. 13, Ward 9, be accepted: Natchitoches, La., Oct. 31, 1921.

To the President and Members of Police Jury, Natchitoches, Parish, Natchitoches, La.

We hereby submit this our bid for a portion of the unmatured bonds of Road District No. 13, Ward 9, of Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana, as follows:  
We bid you a price of ninety cents (90) on the dollar of face value for bonds Nos. 20 to 40, both inclusive, each for the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, and for bonds Nos. 102 to 106, both inclusive, each for the sum of One Hundred Dollars plus accrued interest to date of delivery on all of the said bonds.

Our bid being conditioned on the approval of the legality of the said bonds by our attorney, we reserving the right granted by the laws of Louisiana to name the depository and Fiscal Agent without interest from the said depository or Fiscal Agent, and we name the Exchange Bank of Natchitoches.

We have herewith a certified check for \$200.00 in accordance with your advertisement, and as no evidence of our good faith.

Acting under letter received from the L. E. & N. R. R., relative to discontinuing the Bridge Watchman after October 31st; That Mr. Ambrose Wallette be appointed Bridge Watchman at a salary of \$60.00 per month.

Further, that the District Attorney be requested to make investigation as to the condition of the bridge, the contract of the said L. E. & N. R. R., reading that the bridge shall be returned in good condition. (Carried unanimously.)

That the ordinance of the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches in special session convened;  
That the ordinance of date Sept. 12, 1921, employing the services of J. T.
