School Board Proceedings

Proceedings of the Natchitoches Parish School Board at the regular meeting of said Board held in the City of Natchitoches Louisiana on the third day of January 1922.

The Natchitoches Parish School Board met in regular session in Natchitoches Louisiana, on Tuesday the third day of January 1922, the following members being present to-wit: Messrs. Z. T. Gallion, Jr., A. L. Messick, C. C. Hattaway, J. W. Ingram, L. W. Jacob, J. F. Hawthorne, J. S. Hatch, Samuel Friedman, and M. Barron.

There was absent Mr. E. T. Walker. Resolution by Mr. Hattaway, seconded by Mr. Barron: That the petition from the citizens of the Harris School community asking that their school be re-established be not granted. (Carried unanimously)

Resolution by Mr. Hawthorne, seconded by Mr. Barron: That the transfer which has been conveying the children from the Good Hope community in Ward Seven to the Cypress School be discontinued and that the school at Good Hope be re-established. (Carried unanimously.)

Resolution by Mr. Ingram, seconded by Mr. Jacob: That the transferring of children from the Russell School community in Ward Nine to the Cypress school be discontinued and that the Russell school be re-established; that the two transfers that have been conveying the children from the Russell school to the Cypress school be reduced to one and that said transfer be engaged to transfer children of advanced grades to the said school, the route beginning at Mr. Jack Lease and that ward member Mr. Sam'l Friedman, be commissioned to engage the transfer driver. (Carried unanimously)

Resolution by Mr. Hattaway, seconded by Mr. Ingram: That President Gallion and Superintendent Hooper be authorized to make the necessary exchange of land at Flora school, as follows:

Be it resolved that the Parish School Board of the Parish of Natchitoches convey and deliver unto W. R. Loughridge the following described tract of land situated in Natchitoches Parish in the State of Louisiana, to-wit: A piece of ground situated partly in the Southwest quarter of Southeast quarter of section four and partly in Northwest quarter of Northeast quarter of Section nine, Township Seven, North Range Seven West, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the line between said two Sections, seven chains west of the Southeast corner of the Southwest quarter of said Section four and running thence west along said section line, one hundred and twenty-two and one half yards for a point of beginning; thence north seventy yards; thence east eighty-seven and one-half yards, and thence north seventy yards to the point of beginning. In consideration of the said W. R. Loughridge conveying and delivering to the Parish School Board of the Parish of Natchitoches a tract of land situated in Natchitoches Parish Louisiana, described as follows, to-wit: A piece of ground situated in the Southwest quarter of Southeast quarter of Section four, Township Seven, North Range Seven West, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the line between said section four and nine seven chains west of the Southeast corner of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of said section four and running thence north seventy yards for a point of beginning; thence north seventy yards; thence west one hundred and twenty-two and one half yards, thence south seventy yards; and thence east one hundred and twenty-two and one half yards to point of beginning. (Carried unanimously)

Resolution by Mr. Ingram, seconded by Mr. Hawthorne: That President Gallion and Superintendent Hooper investigate the situation at the Coldwater School as to the advisability of placing an additional teacher at said school and eliminating the transfer which is now being operated from the Coldwater community to the Provençal High School. (Carried unanimously)

Resolution by Mr. Friedman, seconded by Mr. Hawthorne: That three transfers be engaged for the Clouterville School which will begin operation Monday, January 9th, and that ward member, Mr. Barron be given authority to engage said transfers at the following salaries: Bayou Derbonne, long route \$60.00; Bayou Derbonne, short route, \$50.00; Cane River route, \$60.00. (Carried unanimously)

Resolution by Mr. Hattaway, seconded by Mr. Messick: That the President and Superintendent be given authority to enter into a contract with Mr. E. B. Welch, Surveyor, relative to placing unassessed lands of the parish on the tax rolls. (Carried unanimously)

Resolution by Mr. Friedman, seconded by Mr. Hattaway: That the President and Superintendent be authorized to communicate with the District Attorney and Superintendent of Education of Winn Parish relative to timber lands in Section 16, Township 11, Range 5, in Winn and Natchitoches Parishes which were sold to Morgan and Heflin, November 1910, and from which sale one payment was made leaving as the records show an unpaid balance of approximately \$3,700.00 due the two above named Parishes. (Carried unanimously)

There being no further business, upon motion, duly seconded, the Board adjourned.
