**New State Board of Education**  
 At the September primary the people of the Eighth Congressional District will nominate a member of the State Board of Education created under the Constitution.  
 Due to the fact that we are undertaking an educational scheme involving larger appropriations than ever before, it is of paramount importance that the members of this board be men of the highest type and possessed of constructive and conservative ideas in educational matters that the citizenship of the State may receive the highest possible good from the investment.  
 It is understood that Honorable Horace H. White of Alexandria will accept the nomination. The older citizens of Vernon parish have known Mr. White since his youth and understand the high ideals that have been the gauge of his advancement as a lawyer and a citizen of the highest type. The younger generation recognizes his absorbed interest and practical ideas and experience in matters educational and feel the need of the State for just such ability as he possesses.  
 The peculiar fitness of Mr. White for this position justifies the prediction that his candidacy will meet with little or no opposition.

**Relief Work Continues for Flood Sufferers**  
 An appeal from the decision of the Louisiana State Relief Committee stopping all rations to flood victims not still seventy-five per cent under water, or actually suffering, was made by the Parish Relief Committee Saturday.  
 At the meeting of this body Saturday morning in the Police Jury's room it was brought out that the landlords did not intend replanting the overflowed areas, nor did they expect to make provision for their tenants from these districts. If the State expected to give rice, soy beans, peanuts and sorghum for replanting, they would have to ration the people while this was being done.  
 A message was sent the Louisiana State Relief Committee asking for the continuation of rationing for a three weeks period. A wire was later received granting this request.  
 The State will also fill the requisition sent for seeds, though they will furnish no corn. Subscriptions raised locally for flood sufferers will be used to purchase this. Messrs. Milton Keyser and Gatlin, who compose the buying committee, have arranged for the purchase, and are expecting the corn within a few days.  
 The seed will be distributed in the same manner as the rations, and it is hoped they will arrive for delivery at Marco Wednesday, Cloutierville Thursday, and Spanish Lake Saturday. Miss Hawkins, the Red Cross worker representing the State Committee, will remain throughout the continued rationing period.

**Normal News**  
 The State Normal College summer school has now an enrollment of 1081 college students and 226 pupils in the training school, a total of 1307 students, probably the largest body of college students ever assembled in Louisiana for teacher-training purposes. Seven states are represented in the student body, including Mississippi with 12 students; Texas, 4; Arkansas, Missouri, Tennessee and South Dakota, each one.

The capacity of the college has been taxed to its utmost to accommodate the large attendance. The administrators plan to erect a \$200,000 science hall as soon as the funds are in hand.  
 The Freshman class is the largest in the history of the school, the membership being more than 500. In certain subjects it has been found necessary to teach the class in as many as twelve and fifteen sections.

Special features of the summer school which are attracting marked attention are the classes for the training of leaders for Camp Fire Girls and for Boy Scouts, the classes in plays and games, classes in swimming for girls and the class in radio telegraphy and telephony.  
 The special lecturer for the week of June 19-24 will be Dr. Thomas J. Kirby of the University of Iowa.
