Court House News.

Our Sheriff and his deputies are constantly on the alert for bootleggers and seem to have second sight, as it matters not what section of the parish they try the game of distilling or distributing, they spot them and bring them to justice. One of the biggest finds recently was near Shamrock when Tilman Jones, white, had a 96-gallon copper still in operation some of the finished product on hand, and besides sixty days in jail he was fined \$200 and costs, and in default of payment, four months additional.
