RESOLUTION

The following resolution was offered by Mr. W. S. Dowden and seconded by Mr. Airey:

A resolution of a Notice of Intention of the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches to create a Road District which shall include all the territory embraced in ward 8 of the Parish of Natchitoches, the boundaries of said proposed district to be consistent with the boundaries of ward 8 of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, and a meeting of the Police Jury for the hearing of any objections to said creation, and ordering and directing that due notice be given of the intention to create said Road District, in accordance with law.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, that in accordance with provisions of Act 118 of the Legislature of Louisiana, for the year 1921, that a Road District be created within the parish of Natchitoches, which shall include all the territory embraced in ward 8 of the parish of Natchitoches; that the boundaries of said proposed Road District be consistent with the boundaries of ward 8 of the parish of Natchitoches.

Section 2. Be it further resolved, etc., that the Police Jury of the parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, will meet in special session at their regular place at the Court House in Natchitoches, La., on Tuesday, the 2nd day of January, 1923, at eleven (11:00) o'clock a. m., for the purpose of hearing any and all objections to the creation of said proposed Road District; and that after disposing of all objections the Police Jury shall, if it determined to create said Road District, adopt a resolution finally fixing the general boundaries of the District, and give the District a numerical designation and name.

Section 3. Be it further resolved, etc., that the president of this Police Jury be and he is hereby ordered and directed to issue a Notice of Intention of the Police Jury of the parish of Natchitoches to create a Road District to comprise all of that territory embraced within the limits of ward 8 of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, the boundaries of said Road District to be consistent with the boundaries of ward 8 of the parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, and that this Notice of Intention shall embrace substantially all things set forth in this resolution, and be published according to law in the official journal of the parish.

This resolution having been submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows: Yeas, Messrs. Sandlin, Joyner, Copelan, Airey, Knott, Phillips, Dowden, Friedman and Leane. Nays, None. And the resolution was declared adopted.
