JEWELS OF THOUGHT.

Excerpts from President Roosevelt's Speech in Little Rock Arkansas.

"We can afford to be divided on questions of mere partisanship, for comparatively the difference of tariff and the currency are of no consequence. After all, the real question is that of decency in the life of the home and honesty in public life. It makes little difference in the long run whether a Democrat or a Republican is President, but it makes every difference to have all our public officials honest and clean. The candidate is the candidate of his party, but the President, if he is worth his salt, is the President of the whole people.

GOOD PRIVATE LIFE.

"You can't have good public life unless you have good private life. The country will be all right if the average man is decent

and clean in his home life, but if it goes below that average you can't make the country right. I have a great respect for a good man, and the only person I have greater respect for is a good woman; and if there is any one here who does not agree with me I don't think much of him.
"We young men have a great heritage in this free country of ours, and let us see that we transmit it unimpaired to our children. Let their valor and heroism in war and in peace be an incentive to greater efforts."

A Splendid Offer.

Under the above caption, in our issue of October 7th, was the first appearance in print of the very generous offer of Mr. E. A. McIlhenny, made known to us through the kindness of Mr. Louis Indest, Sr. Since then we are pleased to see that both our confreres, the Enterprise and Leader, have given publicity to the offer with favorable comment, in their columns. The offer, as the Iberian first published it, was as follows:

"Very recently Mr. Ed. McIlhenny stated to Mr. Louis Indest, of this city, that he would do a good deal for a straight and direct carriage road from Avery's Island to this city, and invited his cooperation and influence to that end. Mr. McIlhenny offers, \$5000 cash, and then when the new road will have been properly graded and drained he will cover it through its entire length with oyster shells from the McIlhenny cannery."

Since the above publication Mr. Indest advises us that it has been stated to him, that if this road is constructed one of the principal engineers on the island has declared that he would at once put into public service over it one of the modern automobile omnibuses, to run upon a regular schedule, making several trips a day. Such an arrangement—thoroughly practical—would tend largely to annihilating the distance between the island and this city and would bring the two points into closer commercial relations.

We cannot refrain from mentioning the pleasure side of such an arrangement. With a regular service over such a road and a good power boat on Bayou Petite Anse, the resorts, hunting grounds and fishing banks of the coast are at once accessible to the pleasure seeker and sportsman.

Will the Police Jury of Iberia Parish investigate this proposition? Will they make it an item of "new business" at their next regular meeting? Gentlemen: Please do so. Very few greater opportunities knock at our door inaction would be indifference. There will be obstacles in the way of getting the proper and acceptable right of way. There will be charges of "one man's road." Drainage will have to be enquired into. And the who question will have to be carefully weighed.

Re right of way: The people of this city fought for years for the short road to Segura station. To day it bears 90 per cent of the travel of that section. Be fair and just to the rights of the land owner, but do not forget that the public also has rights, and one of these is public highways surveyed and laid out to the greatest public advantage.

Re "one man's road." Is it one man's road? Never. One man offers to contribute 90 per cent of its cost for the privilege of its existence and its common use with others. Has Iberia ever had such a liberal offer for a public highway before?

Re drainage: Any benefits accomplished in this direction will yield such benefits to the adjacent lands that it should commend itself to all parties in interest at one without further argument.

The Southern Pacific Railroad Co. put on another train on Thursday, which train reached this point on time early in the afternoon. The one train a day service is again a thing of the past and memory, to the delight of the whole people. Wednesday's train, scheduled at this point for 4:27 p. m., arrived at about 9 p. m. The trip between New Orleans and this could have been accomplished easily in the time lost.

Quarantines Raised.

On last Saturday night at 9 o'clock the parish quarantine guards against this city were discontinued. It was a surprise to most of our people, but was thoroughly welcomed.

The people of the rural district must have had the first intimation of the impending order, as many country people come in town before the guards were removed, and had to wait until 9 o'clock before they could get out again to their homes.

This city has removed all restrictions against travel between the Crescent City and this place.

A Yellow Fever Rumor.

Several of the oyster shuckers at the McIlhenny cannery, on Avery's Island, were taken suddenly sick the latter part of last week, necessitating the call for physicians from this place. In a short while rumor had it that there were twenty odd cases of yellow fever on the island with one resulting death. These rumors reached far over the country and were made the basis by Abbeville for refusing to remove quarantine restrictions, as announced in the New Orleans press:

Abbeville, Oct. 23.—Vermilion can not raise quarantine yet; not safe; Iberia and Avery's Island both infected. Will advise you in a few days.

The facts that the Bohemian oyster shuckers indulged in eating oysters that had been rejected by the factory expert, resulting in an illness manifesting nausea, purging with cramps, and high fever. All of the sickness at the island seems to have been of this common source, all manifesting the same symptoms, and there appears to have been a good reason for the rumor. But, in all probability, frost will have to crush this rumor too, before the facts will be received in all sections.


