**MANTELL, WITH HAMPT, STARS INFOX DRAMA.**

In "The Unfaithful Wife" He Has Velle Well-Suited to His unusual Talent.

Play Gr. Sways, Thrills.

It Hinges Devotion of Two Men to One Woman Who Loves of Both.

The play, "The Unfaithful Wife" starring Robert B. Mantell and Genevieve Hamper, is one of the strongest dramas that have come from the celebrated William Fox studios. It deals with a woman loved by two men, of whom is already married. The play was written by Murillo and produced by the direction of J. Gordon. Briefly, its story is as follows:  
Fabio Romani (Mr. Mantell) is happily in the love of the beautiful wife, Juliet (Miss Hamper), in whom he believes. Juliet has a friend, Mrs. Durazzi (Mrs. Hamper), whom she has befriended on many occasions. Durazzi and Juliet love each other, but Romani is blind to the bond of affection which is developing day by day between his wife and the artist.

**BRINGING UP FATHER.**

To what difficulties a manager can be put, when contemplating a new production is easily illustrated in the cast of Bringing Up Father, the new Gus Hill attraction which is underlined to hold the boards at Elks Theatre Monday, Jan. 10th. The new offering is based on the successful and popular cartoons of the same title, and created by that gifted artist and humorist George McManus. The ultimate success of the play, which is described as a dancing and singing comedy, depends on the proper kind of actors to interpret the different roles. Of course, competence was essential, but the type had to be considered; that is performers who met with the physical requirements of the roles assigned to them. This was indeed a knotty problem for the management and at one time it looked as if the production would either have to be postponed or probably abandoned. For instance, there are ten leading characters on whose work the plot revolves and develops. They vary from the quite easy going Irishman, Jiggs Mahoney, who is the father, and whose family tries to bring him up. Then there is another type, Jerry Sullivan, also an Irishman, just the opposite of Jiggs, but equally as good natured; Billy Magee, a flippant youth of about twenty four and given to slang, Tom Hamilton, a likeable young Irishman, with a decided brogue. Then there is Pierre Castillon, a tall handsome man of Spanish caste, very genteel and suave, and somewhat Americanized; Mrs. Mahoney, a large and impressive Irish woman, with a domineering air, whose nature assumes a complete change as the play progresses; Eleanor Mahoney, a bright friendly, tall and graceful American girl, Peggy Mahoney, a bright little colleen of twenty, and in striking contrast to her sister Eleanor. Of course there are a few others, who are equally as good. Happily, all of these types have been secured and they form a combination hard to equal. Laughter is the objective point to which all efforts are directed, so well do they succeed that the stereotyped press opinion seems to amount to a single phrase, "The audience laughed heartily from the rise to the fall of the curtain."

**A FATAL ACCIDENT.**

Willie Bouigny, son of Louis Bouigny, an employee of the Estorge Drug Co., whose sale department, fell from a step ladder some two weeks ago. He landed amidst a number of large bottles and demijohns. A number of the glass vessels were broken, resulting in inflicting severe wounds about the shoulder and arm. By Christmas day inflammation had set in in an alarming form. During that day he died. His funeral took place from St. Peters Catholic Church on Sunday evening. He was about 20 years of age. We learn that no one was near him when the accident occurred. He had evidently gone to the top of the shelving and had probably lost his balance in attempting to shift his ladder.

**PNEUMONIA.**

Pneumonia occurs everywhere, in all climates, at all times of the year, and at all ages. It is more frequent in the winter and early spring. It is often called the disease of the old, but it is also common in children. Pneumonia is the most prevalent and most fatal of all acute diseases. It is a frequent complication of typhoid fever, influenza, Bright's disease and other debilitating affections. It is commonly brought on by exposure to cold. We should think of pneumonia very much as we think of influenza or whooping cough as an infection which is spread from man to man through the secretions of the mouth and the nose. Every case should be regarded a point from which infection may be spread. Every one should know that loss of sleep, overwork, worry, poor or insufficient food, lack of exercise, use of alcohol, colds or access of all kinds predispose to pneumonia. Sleeping or working in an overheated, close room, or sudden exposure may also predispose to an attack. To ward off this danger: Sleep with open windows. Ventilate the room where you work. Take some exercise in the open air every day. Don't get "run down."—State Board of Health.
