

WHY PRICES MUST GO HIGHER.

England, in times of peace, exports coal to Sweden and balances the account by importing Swedish pulp. But with the outbreak of the great war the British Empire needed all her fuel supply to operate her munition plants and war ships.

Sweden, in retaliation, has refused to ship pulp to Great Britain, and, owing to her shortage of coal and the dangers and difficulties of ocean traffic, she is now shipping very little pulp to the United States.

South America, Central America, Australia, India, Africa and many of the European countries, finding their usual sources of supply closed to them, clamor to the United States for relief and find that our stock of raw materials is so nearly exhausted that we can scarcely produce enough paper to meet the requirements of our own people.

The god of war has not only appropriated the wood pulp and cotton essential to the manufacture of paper but he has also claimed for his destructive purposes the bulk of available chemicals of scarcely less importance.

Bleached sulphite (wood fibre) that formerly sold for \$2.65 per cwt., now commands as high as \$5.00 per cwt. Bleaching powders that commonly sell for little more than a cent a pound are obtainable even at 13 cents. Soda Ash, Rosin, Satin White, Casein and Alum have doubled and trebled in price. Aulline Colors that the paper manufacturer commonly buys for forty cents per pound are now difficult to obtain even at \$20.00 per pound.

Every article that enters into the production of paper has advanced in price and is still bound to advance to even higher prices. Labor, now feeling the stimulus of war orders, commands more than the same grade of labor could command before the war.

There is no immediate possibility of a speedy return to normal prices. With the curtailment of production of raw materials and the artificial demand for cellulose for the production of high explosives, paper must continue to advance in cost. Even the continuation of hostilities could not restore normal conditions until sufficient time had elapsed to permit industry to return to healthy conditions and to allow for the manufacture of enormous stocks.

To the printer this all means the urgent necessity of advancing his prices in proportion to the general advances in the market. Paper already purchased and held in stock should be valued at today's prices because it cannot be replaced for less.—Paragraphs.

COMMISSIONS GAME WEDNESDAY EVENING.

Officials Elect Promptly Qualified and Were Inducted into their respective Offices.

The commissions for the officers elect of this parish came to Mr. J. G. LeBlanc, the retiring Clerk of Court, on Wednesday afternoon. He gave notice at once to the interested parties and they soon after called at the Clerk's office and subscribed to the usual oath of office and were presented with their commissions.

On Thursday forenoon Mr. P. A. Landry received in charge the Sheriff's office, and he and his assistants promptly assumed the discharge of the duties of the office. Mr. Albert Broussard has been installed in the office as chief deputy and tax collector. Mr. V. M. Aubry is another deputy and he serves the Court. Mr. Lenetz Viator also holds a Deputy Sheriff's appointment.

Up to yesterday noon Mr. J. G. LeBlanc was still in charge of the Clerk of Court's office. Mr. J. A. Gonsoulin, the new clerk elect, extended to him every courtesy and consideration in his power, enabling him to finish up the odds and ends of such work as he had not been able to conclude at once. Mr. Frank Decuir will fill the position of Minute Clerk for the Court and Mr. L. R. Tilly will be the court stenographer. Mr. Caesar Labauve is also of the force of the Clerk's office.

Dr. E. S. Fulton, the Coroner, took charge of his office on Thursday. He was just back from New Orleans where he took part in the organization of the Coroners' Association of Louisiana, and of which organization he was made the second vice president.

The Police Jurors elect qualified on Thursday forenoon and held their initial session in the forenoon and took up the work of organization of the jury. Mr. A. Theriot, one of the members from the 6th Ward, was elected President. Mr. Fritz Dietlien was elected Vice President. Mr. Pierre Jubin succeeds Mr. W. L. Burke as secretary to the Police Jury. All the members of the Police Jury were present at the forenoon session except Mr. Hamilton Derouen of the 5th Ward. It was so near noon when he received word of the meeting, that he decided not to leave home before dinner, for the 14 mile jaunt. He was at the Court House at one o'clock.

In the afternoon the jury reconvened, after the recess for dinner, in a joint session with the members of the retiring jury. The details of unfinished business of the old jury were explained by Dr. W. J. Sanders, President, so that the new jury could intelligently deal with and dispose of them.
