The New Iberia Oil Co. sub-leased its holdings on Little Bayou to the Producers' Oil Co. for a consideration of \$100,000, so it is currently reported. It is also stated that the local company retains for itself, as a condition to the lease, a royalty of 20 per cent—one half of which to go to the land owners and the balance to go to the local company. Hon. P. R. Burke, the attorney who engineered the deal, it is claimed, received a fee of \$10,000.

TRIP TO GUSHER

The party was composed of our host at the steering wheel of his auto, Capt. Jno. T. White, Mr. A. Rosenzweig and the Editor of the Iberian. A very pleasant ride along the roads of the east bank of the Teche showed the splendid condition of a wonderful diversity of crops of this section, cane, corn, cotton, rice, oats, potatoes, and every variety of garden truck.
