JAIL DELIVERY.

Last Tuesday night a regular delivery occurred, the prisoners six in number liberating themselves. Tuesday night jailer Sam Pontis secured the prisoners as usual in the iron cage, and left them for the night. It appears they got possession of a piece of water pipe, with which they attacked a weak spot in the iron wall of the cage and finally made a hole, through which they quickly escaped. In the corridor they pried aside by great force the iron bars, taking out by piecemeal the brick which loosened the bars sufficiently to allow them to be forced aside to give space to get out. Once out they scampered off in different directions, one of prisoners Breaux, colored, had been an interested but silent witness to all the proceedings, and when the prisoners left the jail he left also, but at once returned to Mr. Sam Pontis's house and notified the police. The police were notified and search at once instituted resulting in the capture of one just as he was boarding the early train. Breaux's conduct has been commended by the officers and his sentence was at once cancelled, and his liberty given him. We trust this will be an object lesson to our authorities who will insist on the early completion of the new jail, where security can be absolutely obtained and prisoners get the punishment intended by the Court.

BREVITY FOR ONCE.
ABBVILLE ROAD.

Editor Enterprise:
NEW IBERIA, LA., May 2, '02.
The opening of the Abberville road to Gueydan and Ennice which was inaugurated yesterday by the Southern Pacific Company, running the first through passenger train from this City to Ennice, adds to the commercial territory of New Iberia more than 75 miles of the best portion of the rice belt; a section undergoing at present a most wonderful agricultural development. The vast prairies of the Gueydan district are destined to soon become the center of the rice industry and the trade possibilities there will, in a short time, be immense.

New Iberia should be the trading center for this fast developing country on account of its location and the facilities of shipping and transportation which the Railroad Company offers. We cannot, however, expect to secure the business of that section unless we make some efforts. Crowley, Lake Charles and other competing towns will not be found asleep, and their enterprising merchants will surely capture the business unless our own merchants take advantage of the splendid opportunity that this new country offers.

Many people along the new road have expressed themselves in favor of making New Iberia their trading point and it only remains for our good merchants to meet them half way and we are quite sure that happy and satisfactory results would follow. To establish for ourselves friendly and business relations with the people along the new line would not be a good idea to give a one day excursion to Ennice, in the near future, stopping a sufficient length of time at all the principal towns and stations along the road to meet the business people and properly advertise our various mercantile and manufacturing establishments. The President of the old Board of Trade might call the business men together soon to discuss this proposition and at the same time the opportunity might be a good opportunity to revive and reorganize the Board of Trade on a practical working basis.
