

DEPTH OF CORN CULTIVATION.

The deep and shallow cultivation of corn was discussed by western farmers' institute edition of the Live Stock Indicator, of Kansas City, Mo. As a brief summary of the various papers published, it was said:

Deep and shallow cultivation of corn brings out a variety of views. Those who favor the shallow method are emphatic in their recommendations of the common harrow, both before and after the corn is planted; as it is claimed that no implement will work greater destruction among weeds, while moisture is conserved at the same time. In some cases the harrow is used until the crop is six inches high. The main arguments given for the shallow cultivation are, that corn roots are not disturbed; the surface is left in much better condition for the following crops; less horse power is required, while the shallow mulch is just as effective in conserving moisture. On the other hand deep cultivation is claimed to be better on rich soils, on account of the root pruning, checking the growth of stem and leaves, causing the production of grain. In wet seasons deep cultivation is sometimes essential in order to check weed growth. All are agreed that there is little danger of doing any damage to roots when corn is small.


