THE BATTLESHIP LOUISIANA.

The Secretary of the Navy yesterday announced that one of the new battleships authorized by the naval appropriation bill, just signed by the President, would be named Louisiana. This is in fulfillment of a promise made a year ago by the Secretary Long to Representative Adolph Meyer, of this State. This promise the present secretary was, of course, not bound to keep, hence the compliment comes as a very graceful act on his part.

As provided in the naval appropriation bill, the Louisiana will be one of the largest battleships afloat, having no equal in size in any foreign fleet but in the British. She will have a displacement of 16,000 tons; that is to say, she will be a quarter larger than the Illinois, which visited New Orleans last winter. The ship will have a battery commensurate with her large size. The State will have every reason to be proud of such a namesake.—Pineyune.

STEAM PLOW. The Southern Industrial News says: It is nearly always the case that the progress of an industry is marked by constant improvement as man becomes accustomed to new environments and familiar with local or general conditions. This seems now to be the case in the matter of rice cultivation, and the experiments of S. A. Robertson, a well known contractor in the Texas coast country will undoubtedly lead to a radical revolution in the methods and cost of preparing the land for planting of the new crop.

Mr. Robertson's experiments have determined that by the use of a traction engine commonly employed to haul the rice threshers or from place to place and supply the power necessary to thresh the product or pump water into the growing fields, that the cost of plowing, harrowing and seeding may be reduced to a minimum, destroying a large and generally recognized expense and rendering the employment of plowmen or mules unnecessary. At a cost of not more than 75 cents per acre, Mr. Robertson cultivated his entire rice plantation, located near the Southern Pacific, in this State. He found one engine capable of handling 20 acres, and by using a trio of the machines and working from dawn to dark, he managed to put in condition 200 acres.

The methods employed contemplate the plowing tandem, as it were, using a regular cultivator in lieu of the ordinary cultivator. The harrows are harnessed in the same manner and so, too, were the seeders manipulated. One engine does the work of 10 negroes and 20 mules, and by a substitution of the steam motive power it will be seen at a glance how great a factor of economy has entered the rice area. The innovation will enable the rice farmers to make a considerable profit of rice, should the price be reduced to \$2 per barrel.

HOW TO FIGHT THE STICKFAST FLEA. Mr. T. M. Cullum, of Dallas, Tex., the Silver Wyandotte breeder, tells us that he has purchased five gallons of the Beaumont oil for ten cents, he furnishing the can. With this he proposes to thoroughly saturate the dust or floor of his hen house and every place the flea breeds. At two cents a gallon he can afford to do it, and there is no doubt about it destroying the fleas. We hope later on to hear of the results.

Mr. E. C. Williams, Smithville, Tex., writes: "Will give you my experience with the chicken flea. About May 1 they began to breed, and by the 10th every house was as much a flea house as hen house. Heretofore have been very successful with cold water and salt, but it didn't seem to run them this time, so I tried boiling water with a ball of lye to the pot of water, and in less than three days could not find one. Salt is good before they breed, but it will not kill or run them, but will keep them from breeding if well mixed with the dust in the house or yard."
