MATTERS OF INTEREST.

Many of our readers will be pleased to read the following extract from one of Congressman Broussard's letters to the Enterprise:

"I expect to return to New Iberia in about ten days. By that time the several acts of the Legislature relative to drainage will have become a law, and I desire to take up the matter of cutting the canal from New Iberia to the sea, in an earnest manner.

"In the course of numerous calls at the departments this morning I happened in on the Supervising Architect of the Treasury Department, who informed me that the bid made by Shepard and Bradt, of Atlanta, Ga., for the construction of the New Iberia Post Office building had been accepted and that the contract would be signed shortly.

"This is indeed good news and we hope ere long to see our beautiful P. O. building completed, and our canal full of crafts of all kinds and business booming.

THE FARMER'S INSTITUTE.
