



#### THE THIRD DISTRICT DEMOCRATS.

Mr. St. Clair Adam has just returned from a spellbinding tour of the Third Congressional District, now so ably represented in Congress by the Hon. R. F. Broussard, and had the following to say on the political situation from a Democratic viewpoint:

"This is my second canvas through this district in the interest of Mr. Broussard, and while on my first visit the Republicans showed some strength, and you could see them with the naked eye, I am gratified to say that on the present trip I was unable to see any, even with the aid of a search warrant and opera glasses. Without levity, it is my judgment, and the judgment of all Democrats in those parts, that the Republican Party will not cast at the coming election 15 per cent of the entire vote. I spoke in Assumption, St. Mary and Lafourche, and in all those parishes the Democratic Party is united and aggressive, and the Sheriff's books show that a great number of poll taxes have been paid. In St. Mary there is a qualified vote of 1,600. The sentiment in the parish seems to be against the repeal of the poll tax qualification as a prerequisite to voting, and I will venture the prediction that the constitutional amendment which will be voted upon by the people at this election repealing the poll tax clause of the Constitution of 1898 will be rejected. The people regard the poll tax qualification as an additional safeguard against negro suffrage, and are determined to let the law remain an ornamental part of the Constitution. Owing to the action of Mr. Roosevelt in advocating so strenuously the reciprocity measure that was before the last Congress that contemplated taking off the 20 per cent of the duty on Cuban sugar, a great many of the sugar planters in the Third District are returning to the Democratic Party, as they rightly believe that the Republican party is inimical to their interests, and that they have more to hope from the success of the Democrats. It is patent even to the intelligence of a pig-pong player that Mr. Roosevelt and his party have no sympathy with the South and her interests, and the sugar man has at last opened his eyes to the true situation, thank Allah. It is my prediction, without claiming the talents of the fortune-teller, that Mr. Broussard will receive 85 per cent of the total vote east, and make the Republican party retire to the extreme rear for a couple of years yet to come."

#### INCREASED COST OF LIVING.

The fall dinner pail was the paramount Republican argument a few years ago. If that party was responsible for such a happy condition of affairs it will also have to be credited with the increase or decrease in the cost of living.

Following are some of the conclusions taken from the tables of the Massachusetts Bureau of Statistics, published in 1902:

Since 1897 prices have varied as follows:

Wheat flour, for family use, decreased 19.14 per cent.  
Oolong tea increased 16.38 per cent.  
Coffee of the green variety is one of the necessities that went down, the decrease being 29.49 per cent.  
Granulated sugar is also 8.70 per cent. less in price.  
Common soap costs 33.58 per cent. more, and starch 11.11 per cent.

A great increase is shown in the price of meats.  
Beef ranges from 9.08 to 35 per cent. higher in value.  
Fore quarters of mutton are 46.92 per cent. more valuable than 5 years ago.  
Fresh pork shows a 40 per cent. gain, and salted pork 3.08 per cent.  
Sausages are up 15.97 per cent. and butter, lard, cheese, milk and potatoes show substantial rises in selling value.

While coal has been soaring, wood has come down from 1.92 to 3.55 per cent.

Thus in the last five years the cost of living has increased forty per cent; but while wages may have increased some, they certainly have not been advanced forty per cent.—Memphis Appeal.

#### GETTING RID OF STUMPS.

Plowing in stumpy ground where the implement strikes a root or stump every few feet is anything but a pleasant operation; and is particularly unpleasant if the day happens to be hot and dry.

There are several ways to get rid of stumps, all of which are practical enough and will do the work. First, blow them up. Gunpowder will not do this but dynamite will. A careful man can do this without danger, or at least with no more danger than with powder; but a hiring or heedless fellow should not be allowed to handle the stuff at all, or he may blow himself and everybody else around out of existence. The process is this: place a cartridge of dynamite in a cavity made by a long straight crowbar underneath the stump, tamp well and explode the cap, using a small electrical apparatus. Be sure always to retreat a safe distance from the stump in good time.

Second, make a sheetrock chimney about five feet high and wide enough to go over stump, build a fire on the inside, and the draft will cause it to consume the stump if it is well seasoned and there has been a long spell of dry weather just preceding.

Third, bore a hole in the stump with a two-inch auger eighteen inches deep and fill it with kerosene, plug up and leave for a few months, fire, and it is said they will burn down to the roots. We can not vouch for this.

Fourth, most trustworthy of all the plan of extracting them by machinery. A tripod standing about eight or nine feet high is placed over the stump, a powerful screw reaches down to the stump and is attached to a chain which is placed around a leading lateral. A horse is then attached to the sweep and the screw slowly lifts the stump from the earth. The chain being hitched to a side-root it exerts a much greater power than it would pulling the stump perpendicularly.
