

REGULAR MEETING POLICE JURY.

NEW IBERIA, LA., Nov. 6th, 1902. The Police Jury convened this day with President Brittain in the chair and all the members present except Messrs. DeCour and DeLambert.

On motion duly carried, the sum of ten dollars was appropriated towards assisting the Industrial in its efforts to advertise its products.

It was moved, seconded and carried, by a unanimous vote of the Police Jury of this Parish of Iberia at its session held this 6th day of November, 1902, that Mr. Louis Angers be given and granted the contract to build the wooden bridge at Olivier Station and the wooden bridge near at W. Weche's across the Bayou Teche.

Be it further ordained that as soon as Mr. Louis Angers shall have all the material for the construction of these two bridges on the site the President and Secretary of the Police Jury are hereby authorized and empowered to execute a contract on behalf of the Parish of Iberia in favor of Mr. Louis Angers for the sum of Three Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars, payable in cash on the 1st day of January, 1903, with five per cent per annum interest on Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars from date until paid.

Be it further ordained that in order to assure the payment of both of these notes and interest promptly at maturity, there is hereby set aside and devoted to this purpose a sum of one-third of the ten mills tax to be assessed and collected on all the assessable property within the Parish of Iberia for the years 1903 and 1904 for parol purposes which is hereby pledged and devoted towards the payment of these two notes with the accrued interest at maturity, and which amount shall not be used for any other purpose and that the Ordinance adopted Oct. 24, 1902, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Thus done, read, adopted and signed in open session this 6th day of November A. D. 1902. J. F. BRITTAIN, President. Messrs. Brittain and Gonla presented verbally that in their conference with the Iberia and St. Mary Drainage Commission it was agreed that the Parish would furnish the lumber for bridges over canals cut by said Commission and said Commission bound itself to build same at its expense.

The Treasurer submitted his regular monthly report showing a cash balance of \$13.01. Report was adopted. It was moved to Mr. Ortle and carried that advertisement for franchise be discontinued.

It was again moved by Mr. Ortle and carried that a special meeting of Police Jury be and is hereby called for Saturday 15th instant, to consider proposition of selling franchise for electric railway between New Iberia and Jeanerette.

Permission was granted land owners to open road between Lake Simmonette and Bull Island. Messrs. M. David, Arthur LeBlanc and S. Viator were appointed committee to attend to the opening of said road.
