CAPT. E. T. KING.

On Thursday the 11th instant, Death, the relentless, invaded our community again and taken hence the soul of our beloved citizen, Capt. E. T. King, at the ripe old age of 88 years. He was born at Monte Vallo, Ala., on the 2d of May, 1823, coming to Louisiana in his early manhood and engaging in planting and cattle raising in the Parish of St. Martin.

In the early fifties he was married to Miss Margaret Ann Marsh, this union was blessed with four children, two daughters, both deceased and two sons, Dr. Henry A. King of this City and Ed. M. King of this Parish, who survived him. Capt. King led a busy life, a man of high order of intelligence, his talents were soon recognized and used for the public good. He was a member of the Legislature during the Nicholls administration, was prominent in all matters affecting the reclamation of our swamps and was a clever writer advocating the closing of old river and the divorce of the Red, was well versed in statistics concerning these subjects and he was frequently called upon by the authorities of the State and nation to furnish valuable information, was also prominent in the opening and locking of Bayou Plaquemine. Served with distinction in the Confederate Army with the rank of Captain, losing an eye in one of the hotly contested battles. He was always a staunch believer in the people and their ability to govern the State.

The funeral services occurred at the Episcopal Church, Rev. R. Diggs, officiating. The Knights of Temperance, Teche Encampment, No. 18, of which he was a valued member attended the funeral in a body escorting the remains to the Cemetery.

**FARMERS DEMONSTRATION.**  
Baton Rouge, La., Jan. 4, '12.  
Editor Enterprise—We have been notified by the Southeastern Passenger Association that a reduced rate of one and one-third fare plus twenty-five cents will be given on all railroads east of the Mississippi river to those who wish to attend the Farmers' Short Course or Demonstration Conference, which is to be held here Jan. 8-19, 1912, provided there are 200 in attendance.

It will be necessary to pay full fare from starting point to Baton Rouge and take receipt from railway agent. If the attendance reaches 200 the return ticket will be sold for one-third regular fare plus twenty-five cents.

The Southwestern Passenger Association will in all probability grant the same rate, under the same conditions, as that granted by the Southeastern Association for all railroads west of the Mississippi river and, therefore, a receipt should also be taken from agents on the west side of the river.
