SYNOPSIS OF COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

New Iberia, March 18, 1912.

The Council convened in regular session with Mayor Power in the chair and all the members present, consisting of Octave Renoulet, R. D. Southwell, Victor Erath, Clet Girard, Luke Trainor, Wm. Lassalle, R. P. Ribbeck and Numa Miguez.

The reading of the minutes of previous meeting by Secretary Compton was adopted and signed.

The reading of bills against the City were read and ordered paid.

An ordinance was adopted accepting the new corporate limits extended to Lietmeyer property on lower Main Street.

The following message of the Mayor was then read and adopted:

"I am in receipt of several estimates on the cost of a preliminary survey for the installation of a sewerage system in this City, which estimates I respectfully submit for your consideration.

It seems to be the will of our taxpayers to have a thorough sanitary sewerage system and I deem the time opportune to place the matter before the people that they may decide by election whether or not it is the will of the majority.

Honorable Body select an engineer from among the present applicants, so that we may at once have the necessary surveys in order to place the question before our people in a concrete and businesslike form. This will necessitate an appropriation, which we should not hesitate in making; and if the election carries, the amount so appropriated will be included in the amount voted, if the election fails, of which there is very little fear, we can easily manage to cover out of our 1912 budget.

I trust that this proposition will be taken up at this meeting and will be favorably acted upon without any delay."

On motion, duly carried the proposition of Mr. H. A. Kramer, consulting engineer of Magnolia, Miss., was read with the several propositions of other engineers relative to sewerage and the Mayor was instructed to notify Mr. Kramer to come to New Iberia at his earliest convenience in regard to the proposition submitted by him and a special meeting will be called upon his arrival.

The proposition of Mr. Harry K. Johnson of the Cheatham Construction Company was read and on motion a committee composed of the Mayor and Mr. R. D. Southwell was appointed to get the sense of the property holders along the line of Main Street from the Postoffice to the lower end of the City to construct a gravel street so as to connect with the proposed Model Road to Jeanerette.

The repairs of the bridge spanning the Teche at Bridge Street was referred to the Street and Bridge Committee.

The Mayor was requested to ascertain the price of driving piling at the turn hole so as to protect Bayou street from caving.

On motion, the Mayor was instructed to communicate with Mr. R. J. Lockwood of the Frisco Railroad to meet the committee composed of Messrs. Octave Renoulet, Clet Girard and himself to take up the filling of the Bayou front as per franchise granted them some months since.
