### LEAGUE NOTES.

The Civic League met in regular session on Monday afternoon at the Pythian building. There was a good attendance and two applications for membership were received and passed upon.

Prof. Ralph W. Frame by the invitation of the League gave a talk upon the desirability of introducing Domestic Science and later on, Manual Training into the New Iberia High School. The League is entirely in favor of this step and is prepared to do all in its power to popularize the movement provided it is the desire of the girls and their mothers to install Domestic Science as a new branch of study.

Mr. Frame's remarks were particularly interesting to the League which will take steps immediately to use its influence by petition to the local school board and by their means to bring about the result.

Doubtless, in case of the instituting of this work, there will be a large and enthusiastic class enrolled; for, what more important as a part of a liberal education for our girls than a knowledge of the home-making and house-keeping?

The following formed part of Mr. Frame's address:

"At present we teach them History, Ancient, Medieval and Modern—from earliest date to describe the sweep of ages—but they cannot sweep a floor!"

We teach them to use their fingers dexterously, in painting and drawing; but are a girl's fingers really educated when they cannot cut, fit and sew a dress?

We teach them Literature, Ancient, Foreign and American. So trained are they that after reading a classic they can write an excellent critique of it.

We even teach them to write original stories and essays. But how few of our girls can write a recipe for a cake or a loaf of bread?

We teach them Geography. So well versed do they become that they can, without hesitation tell where the Amazon, Senegambia and the Islands of the seas. But they cannot correctly lay a table for a luncheon. We teach them Arithmetic, Geometry, Trigonometry, so skilled do they become that they can find any "Unknown Quantity" without difficulty! But the dignity of respect for work and for all honest workers and intimate knowledge of the homely household duties are to them "unknown quantities." They can even tell how many minutes it takes a ray of light to travel from the sun to the earth. But very few could tell just how long it takes to properly boil an egg!

I suppose that they can all make fudge but how many can make good corn bread?"
