Section 3. Be it further ordained and resolved by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, that the appropriation of Forty Thousand Dollars, with five per cent interest per annum herein named shall be funded into eighty bonds with annual interest coupons attached, each bond being for the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, and being serial bonds from 1 to 80 inclusive, bearing five per cent interest per annum payable annually, except that bonds numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 and interest coupons for the year 1913, shall be retired and paid in five months; the entire issue to be dated August 15th, 1913 and to be due and payable January 15th, 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922 and 1923, the bonds to be retired each year to be in their numerical order, beginning with Number 1.

Section 4. Be it further ordained and resolved by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, that the President and the Secretary of the Police Jury shall adopt the form, verbiage and style of the bonds and coupons herein provided for and shall sign the same. A facsimile signature of the President and Secretary may be used for the Coupons.

Section 5. Be it further ordained and resolved by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, that the proceeds of the bonds herein provided for shall be used solely for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a system of public highways throughout the Parish of Iberia; and shall not be diverted or used for any other purpose; and that the purpose is to conform with Article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana with reference to an appropriation and bonds for the construction of highways, and that no inadvertence, omission or ambiguity in these presents shall effect the validity of said bonds, and that any purchaser or purchasers thereof will be assumed to have purchased the same upon the solemn declaration that the Police Jury of Iberia Parish will at any and all times do whatever may be incumbent or necessary to promptly retire the said bonds as they respectively mature; and pay the interest coupons likewise, as they respectively mature.

Section 6. Be it further ordained and resolved by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, that the budget drawn and prepared by the Police Jury each year during the period of years enumerated shall include and provide for an annual sum adequate and sufficient to pay the interest coupons and Eight bonds each year during the years enumerated; but that any failure to so budget shall in no wise or manner affect the payment of the bonds to be retired each year, together with the interest coupons due; and that irrespective of the budget, an amount sufficient and adequate or this purpose is hereby irrevocably dedicated for the years 1913, 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920, 1921 and 1922.
