**ARTICLE V.**

The corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in a board of three directors to be elected by a majority of the

board shall hold office for one year or until their successors shall have been elected. In case of failure to elect directors on the day herein fixed, this corporation shall not be dissolved but the incumbent directors shall continue in office until their successors shall have been elected and qualified. If any vacancy should occur on the board of directors the same shall be filled by the remaining directors by appointment from among the stockholders.

**ARTICLE VI.**

The board of directors shall have power to make, adopt or repeal such rules and regulations for the conduct, management and business of the corporation as they may deem proper; to appoint from time to time such officers, agents, clerks or other employees as they may deem necessary and to discharge at pleasure. All salaries and compensations for agents, clerks and employees shall be fixed by the board of directors and same shall be changed at their pleasure.

**ARTICLE VII.**

The officers of this corporation shall consist of a President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer elected by the board of directors at their first meeting to be held on the first Monday of August, each year at every annual election notices thereof shall be given to the stockholders by publication ten days previous to the said meeting and at the annual meeting of the said stockholders they may vote by proxy.

**ARTICLE VIII.**
