But all that has changed. One of the liveliest bankers in Southwest Louisiana told me three weeks ago, "Our bank is anxious to help the farmers, but we will not advance one dollar to finance the farmer who does not diversify."

Another uptodate banker told me, "I am glad to help along your 'Potato Day' campaign. I wrote 125 letters to our farmer clients urging them to attend your meeting. We are going to help them take up the work."

Bankers and merchants forced the one-crop system; now, repenting of their mistake, they are helping the farmers to diversify.

Are you pulling your part of the load? Pumpkin Yams for the early market, constitute one step in the direction of diversification and prosperity; lespecheza is another step.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Iberia, 19th Jud. Dist. Court.
