CHARTER OF THE NEW IBERIA DAIRY COMPANY.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF IBERIA.

It is known that on this Thirteenth day of the month of March, A. D., 1914, we, the undersigned, a Notary Public, in and for the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned, qualified, and in the presence of the persons hereinafter named and understood, personally came and appeared several parties whose names are subscribed, all of full age, who have declared that, availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana relative to corporations and especially of Act No. 78 of the General Assembly of Louisiana, passed in 1904, they have covenanted, agreed, and by these presents they consent and agree to bind themselves, as well as such other persons as hereafter become associated with them to form and constitute a corporation, body politic, in law, for the purposes, objects, and under the conditions, articles and conditions following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I. The name and title of the said corporation shall be "NEW IBERIA DAIRY COMPANY" and its domicile shall be in the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, under its said corporate name corporation shall have power and authority to contract, sue and be sued; make and use a corporate seal, and same to break and alter at pleasure; receive, have, purchase, improve, convey, sell, rent, borrow, mortgage and hypothecate under corporate name, property, real, personal and mixed; to name and appoint officers, directors, agents and employees, as the interest or convenience of the said corporation may require; to make and establish by-laws, and regulations for the proper management and regulation of its affairs, as may be deemed necessary and proper, and to do all other acts and things permitted by law, or as shall be necessary and proper to carry out the objects and purposes of said corporation, unless sooner discontinued in accordance with its charter, and to continue for the period of fifty years from and after the date hereof.

President, or, in his absence, the Secretary, shall be the proper person whom citation or other legal process shall be served, and the President authorized to sue on behalf of said corporation without special authorization of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes for which the corporation is organized, and the business to be carried on, are declared to be the following, to-wit: To carry on, conduct and operate a Dairy business, to buy and sell all of its products and by-products, such as butter, buttermilk, cream, etc., to buy, sell, breed and raise cattle, horses, hogs and live stock of every kind and description; to butcher and sell the beef, pork and other products of cattle and other live stock; to own and own wagons, horses, milk cans and other appliances and implements used in the aforesaid business, and to do and perform all acts and things usual, requisite and necessary in the operation and conduct of the said business.

ARTICLE III.

The capital stock of the said corporation shall be Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00), divided into Thirty Shares of the par value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) each, which stock shall be paid for in cash at the time of subscription, or the same may be issued at not less than par in payment or exchange for property or rights actually received or purchased by said corporation, or the same may be issued, full paid, for money advanced, or for such other valuable consideration or services as the Board of Directors of said Corporation may determine; provided that no stock shall be issued until the consideration therefor has been received by the said corporation.

No transfer of stock of said corporation shall be recognized unless such transfer thereof shall have been made on the books of the corporation on the surrender of the certificate therefor. This corporation shall commence doing business, as soon as all of the capital stock shall have been subscribed for.

ARTICLE IV.

The corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a Board of Three (3) Directors, elected from among the stockholders, consisting of the President, Secretary and one Stockholder. A majority of said Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

The following named persons are declared to be the incorporators of this Company as follows: Julien T. Eves, One (1) share and Alexander P. Eves, One (1) share. And the said incorporators shall constitute the First Board of Directors, with Julien T. Eves as President, and Alexander P. Eves as Secretary. They shall hold their offices until their successors have been duly elected. The Directors are to be elected annually, on the Third Tuesday of January of each year, by ballot at the office of the said corporation, under the supervision of one commissioner to be appointed by the President, after ten days written notice to the stockholders. Each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote, in person or by proxy, and a majority of the votes cast shall elect any vacancy on the Board of Directors shall be filled for the remainder of the year by election by the remaining directors. A failure to elect directors on the date specified, shall not dissolve this corporation, but the directors then in office shall remain in office until their successors are elected, and they shall, as soon as possible cause an election to be held as above provided. At the first meeting following their election, they shall elect one of their number to be President and another to be Secretary.

ARTICLE V.

The said Board of Directors shall have full control and management of the property, business and affairs of this corporation, and shall conduct, manage and use the same as in their discretion they deem fit, and as is consistent with the objects of this corporation.

The Board of Directors is authorized to frame and adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations as the affairs and business of the corporation may require, and as it deems necessary for the conduct and management thereof.

ARTICLE VI.

This charter may be changed, modified or amended, the capital stock increased or decreased by compliance with the formalities of law, or this corporation may be dissolved at a general meeting of the stockholders convened for the purpose, with the assent of three-fourths of the entire subscribed capital stock, whether present or represented at said meeting.

Notice of such meeting shall be given by at least thirty days' continuous publication immediately preceding said meeting in one of the newspapers published in the City of New Iberia, Louisiana.

In case of dissolution or termination of this corporation, either by limitation of its charter, or from any cause, the liquidation of its affairs shall be conducted by three commissioners selected from the stockholders, with like assent and at a meeting called for that purpose as above set forth in this article.

ARTICLE VII.

No stockholder of this corporation shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts or debts thereof in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the corporation on the shares of stock subscribed for or owned by him; nor shall any informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null or of exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the unpaid balance, if any, of his stock.

ORDINANCE No. 31.

An Ordinance entitled the "Annual Appropriation Ordinance" levying an annual tax of ten mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the City property provide a revenue to defray the expenses of the City Government for the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1914; and also to levy a special tax of three mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all taxable property within the City of New Iberia, (excepting that property taken in by recent extension of corporate limits, situated adjoining the lower corporate limits), to pay the interest and a portion of the principal due on the Electric Light and Water Bonds; and also to levy a special tax of three mills on the dollar on all taxable property within the City of New Iberia (excepting that property situated on the East Side of Bayou Teche and property taken in by recent extension of corporate limits adjoining lower corporate limits), to pay the interest and a portion of the principal of the debt contracted by the New Iberia Southern Drainage District; and also a tax of three and one-half mills on the dollar on all taxable property within the City of New Iberia, in aid of the New Iberia and Northern Railroad Company; and also a tax of two mills on the dollar on all taxable property within the limits of the City of New Iberia in aid of the Southwestern Traction & Power Company all of which special taxes were voted by the property taxpayers of the City of New Iberia, was presented by Mr. Villiermin and read, when it was moved by Mr. Villiermin, seconded by Mr. Suberbielle, and adopted by the following Yea and Nay vote to-wit: Yea, Messrs. Fontelleu Suberbielle and Villiermin; Nay, None.

Which said ordinance reads as follows: Be it ordained by the Trustees of the City of New Iberia, That in order to provide for the payment of expenditures of the City Government for the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1914, in accordance with the budget of revenues and expenditures adopted by the Board of Trustees on November 3rd, 1913, there shall be levied a tax upon all taxable property within the limits of the City of New Iberia, not specially exempted under the State laws or the laws of the United States, amounting in the aggregate to ten mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all property situated within the limits of the City of New Iberia, for the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1914, with a cost and penalty at the rate of two per cent per month on taxes due on movable property not paid on or before November 1st, 1914, and a like cost and penalty on taxes due on immovable property not paid on or before January 1st, 1915.

Be it further ordained, That an additional three mill special tax on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all taxable property within the City of New Iberia (excepting that property taken in by recent extension of the corporate limits situated adjoining the lower corporate limits), be levied as authorized by a vote of the property taxpayers of the City of New Iberia, at an election held, for the purpose of paying the interest and a portion of the principal due upon the Electric Light and Water Bonds issued by the City of New Iberia; and that said special tax be collected at the same time and in the same manner as the Municipal taxes, and that said tax shall be paid in current money of the United States.

Be it further ordained, that an additional three mill tax on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all taxable property of the City of New Iberia be levied as authorized by a vote of the taxpayers of the City of New Iberia, at an election held, for the purpose of aiding the New Iberia and Northern Railroad Company; and that said special tax be collected at the same time and in the same manner as the Municipal taxes; and that said tax be paid in current money of the United States.

Be it further ordained, that an additional tax of two mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all taxable property of the City of New Iberia, be levied as authorized by a vote of the taxpayers of the City of New Iberia, at an election held, for the purpose of aiding the Southwestern Traction and Power Company, and that said special tax be collected at the same time and in the same manner as the Municipal taxes, and that said tax be paid in current money of the United States.

This Ordinance known as the Annual Appropriation Ordinance is adopted to comply with sections 78 and 79 of the Charter of the City of New Iberia, and is for the purpose of levying the necessary revenues to defray the expenses of the City Government as per the budget of 1914, previously adopted in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter, and which budget of revenues and expenditures is as follows:

The proposal of the Police Jury of the Parish of Iberia, La., for renting the old Parish Jail to the City of New Iberia was submitted, and was accepted on motion of Mr. Villiermin duly seconded by Mr. Fontelleu and carried; said rental being fixed by the Police Jury at \$15 per month.
