### UNINTENTIONAL WRONG.

In our article of last week with relation to the reason why little attention was given violations of the Sunday law by our City Executive for the past few months, we did the District Court an injustice, as we were under the impression the cases that were tried by Judge Davis and an appeal taken, had been dead docketed, which we so stated, doing Judge Simon an unintentional injustice. Through the courtesy of the minute Clerk of the Court, A. J. Maumus, we were given a resume of the Court proceedings in that matter, which is attached hereto: "The five parties were arrested on the affidavit of R. Miguez, August 26, 1912, for the violation of the Sunday law on Sunday, August 25th, 1912.

The defendants were tried and convicted on the testimony of Louis Schoenman, Felix Romero and Rumald Miguez and fined \$200.00 and in default of payment to imprisonment in the Parish jail during thirty days.

From this judgment and sentence, defendants appealed to the District Court, and the appeals were filed in the District Court on September 10th, 1912.

On the 27th day of January 1913, the defendants were tried

by the District Court, A. N. Muller, District Attorney, representing the State, Edwin S. Broussard, Esq., representing the defendants.

When after hearing the sworn testimony of W. L. Schoenman, Felix Romero, Rumald Miguez, the Court reversed the judgment and sentence of the City Court.

In his oral reasons for acquittal of the accused, the Court stated that no evidence was addressed justifying a conviction for the reason that none of the witnesses testified that they had seen any one selling any liquors at the bar, merely testifying that their place of business was opened but did not see any one selling or buying drinks."

### JUDGE'S ELECTION DATE SET.

Hon. J. Gabi LeBlanc having received the subpoenaed letter last Thursday morning anent the election of a City Judge, Mr. A. J. Maumus, Chairman of the Parish Democratic Committee immediately issued notices to the members of the Committee requesting them to meet this morning at eleven o'clock for the purpose of setting the date of the two primaries and otherwise prorating the cost to be incurred in defraying some of the expenses which will fall upon the candidates. From what we are able to learn from members of the Parish Executive Committee the date of the first Primary will be July 7th, the second to be held on the 14th which will give ample time for the candidates to make a canvas among the voters, the general election falling on the 21st day of July. It is probable that nomination papers will have to be handed in to the Committee on or before the night of June 25th.

### STOCK RAISING AND AGRICULTURAL MEETING A SUCCESS.

The meeting last Tuesday evening at the Elk Theatre under the auspices of the New Iberia Chamber of Commerce and Southwest Louisiana Development Bureau wherein the eradication of cattle tick, breeding cattle for the market, dairying, silos and kindred questions were discussed was one of the most interesting ever held in New Iberia. The meeting was called to order at about 7:30 o'clock by Mayor Fontelieu who introduced the speakers in their regular order and marked attention was paid by the audience to all of them. The first to speak was the Hon. W. C. Chevis, manager of the Southwest Louisiana Development Bureau, whose headquarters is in Lafayette and showed the interest the gentleman is taking in developing our section of the State. He was followed by an interesting address delivered by Mr. Young of the Agricultural Department of the Southern Pacific Railroad and everybody present regretted it when he brought his subject to a close. Both Drs. Wight of the Bureau of Animal Industry of the United States Department of Agriculture and W. H. Dalrymple of the chair of the Veterinary Science, Louisiana State University discussed cattle tick eradication and what could be done in making this the stock and dairy section of the South.

Both the Southern Pacific and New Iberia and Northern brought in a large number of people from the surrounding country, at least one hundred and fifty coming from Arnaudville and Loreauville via the New Iberia and Northern who made special efforts to induce them to make New Iberia a visit and attend the meeting. Upon the arrival of the train they were all invited to visit the Creamery and explained the workings of the plant by Mr. J. C. Hendrick, the courteous manager of the concern. Had it not been for the inclement weather which came on a few hours before the meeting opened we are satisfied a larger number of Iberians would have been present.
