

SULPHUR INDUSTRY.

Twenty years ago 446 tons of sulphur valued at \$20,000 were marketed. In 1900 more than 3000 tons, valued at \$88,100, were marketed. Manufacturers' Record, 1901, shows 127,292 tons were marketed at a value of \$2,663,760. Increase between 1894 and 1901 was due solely to the successful inauguration in Louisiana of the Frasch process of mining sulphur in a field in Calcasieu parish containing vast deposits.

Since 1904 the market for the American product has been high as 369,444 tons, valued at \$6,668,215, and last year were marketed 311,590 tons, valued at \$5,479,849, production in the Bryan Heights region near Port, Texas, having begun in 1904, and Wyoming also contributing some little to the total.

Many years Sicily dominated sulphur production in the world, and it still markets more than any other country. But now the United States ranks second in sulphur production in the world. Hardly had the Frasch process been started in Louisiana when Sicily began to feel its effect. The latest manifestations recorded in a decline in exports from Italy to the United States between 1910 and 1913 10,704 tons, valued at \$201,125 tons, valued at \$3,046, an increase in the same year from 30,731 tons, valued at \$52,941 to 89,221 tons, valued at \$1,599,761. In 1910 the exports of sulphur were but 2,095 tons more than the imports. In the excess of exports over imports was 66,616 tons. In 1911 the exports from this country had nearly trebled in value and in value.—L. C.

All this can be done if you dip their stock once in a while and then they will realize the foodstuff will put on weight, where before it failed to do results.—Houston Times.

WHY THE SOUTH OUGHT TO BE A LIVESTOCK COUNTRY.

The South ought to be a live stock country, because:

(1) A crop of cowpeas, soy beans, peanuts, or lespedeza (all legumes) may be grown the same season after an oat crop is harvested. There is no better feed than oats, and cowpeas and lespedeza are the equal of red clover as hay producers; while peanuts and soy beans will produce as much feed (concentrates) as any crop grown here or elsewhere.

(2) A soil made rich by the growing of legumes and livestock farming will make as much corn or silage per acre as in the Corn Belt, and the same season produce a crop of crimson clover equal in feeding value to a crop of red clover.

(3) Our climatic conditions make us a cotton-producing country. One of the by-products of the cotton crop is cottonseed meal, the cheapest protein feed known. The South produces 450,000,000 bushels of cottonseed annually, which pound for pound is superior to corn in feeding value. If the South could not have produced cotton she would have grown livestock just as other sections have turned to livestock, where one-crop systems depleted their soils and forced them to do so.

The South must grow livestock, because while it is possible to build up soil fertility without feeding livestock, it is not generally done, and cannot be done as economically as by feeding the legumes, which must be grown to build up the fertility, to good livestock.

The need of the South is for men who will study livestock raising as a part of their general farming system, for there is no reason why the South cannot or does not grow livestock more profitably than any other section, except that we have not the men with either the inclination or information to do so.—The Progressive Farmer.

THE FRUIT OF "DIVINE RIGHT"

When we have recovered from the horror of the assassination of the Austrian archduke and his wife, and the pity of it, we shall realize that, useless as it was, and pitiful as it was, it was merely the logical result of the perpetuation of the tyrannous rule of the house of Hapsburg and its "divine right" to oppress. There is no defense for the murderer. But his crime was nevertheless the result of autocratic rule based on inherited "divine right."

The Hapsburgs and the Romanoffs have been "unlucky" houses, in that many individual members of their dynasties have been assassinated. The aged emperor of Austria has seen several members of his immediate family fall into the hands of assassins, and his brother was executed fifty years ago in Mexico, for the same reason that many of his relatives were struck by assassins. None of them were put to death because their killers hated them personally, but because they represented the idea of absolute monarchy based on hereditary "divine right."

The boy who slew the future emperor of Austria was misguided and his deed will probably serve no good end, but it should be taken as a protest, though a mistaken one, against tyranny and the dying theory of the divine right of kings.—Beaumont Enterprise.

CHARBON LOSS THIS YEAR WILL REACH \$1,000,000.

Austin, Texas, July 7.—Reports received by the state health department from the charbon infected districts of Texas prove that vaccination is a preventative of the disease. Vaccination earlier in the year, it is claimed by the department, would have prevented the epidemic now raging. Those herds which were vaccinated at the proper time have not been touched by charbon, but those not vaccinated have died by scores.

The health department estimates that the loss to cattle from charbon so far this year is close to \$500,000 and that the total amount will go to \$1,000,000 before the end of the year.

WIRELESS MESSAGES TO GO AROUND THE WORLD.

The world is now almost and soon will be completely betted with wireless, according to the recent issue of Popular Mechanics Magazine. The United States is preparing to cover the western hemisphere with towers capable of communicating across the Atlantic, through the use of relay stations, from one side of the Pacific to the other. At the last International Wireless Congress, at which were representatives from all the civilized nations of the world, it was planned that Great Britain should erect a gigantic wireless tower on the banks of the Suez Canal and another at Calcutta; that Japan should build one at Yokohama, that Italy should construct one near Messina, and these, with the one already working from the top of Eiffel Tower in Paris and with what this government contributes to world communication at Guam Honolulu as well as throughout America, will be sufficient to girdle the world, and, by preconcerted arrangement, transmit messages from any part of the world almost instantly.

GUARDING PANAMA CANAL AGAINST FOREIGN FOES.

In addition to the 12-in. and 16-in. coast-defense rifles, mounted on disappearing carriages, which will constitute the main defenses of the Panama Canal against attack from the sea, several of the newest type of sea-coast mortars are to be placed in pits, from whence they can discharge shells without disclosing their own position. These new mortars, the most powerful ever built, have a range of 11 miles and can send a shell five miles high, to drop with terrific velocity on the deck of an enemy's ship. These guns are shown in several views appearing in the July Popular Mechanics Magazine.

POST-OFFICE CLERKS USE ROLLER SKATES.

Clerks in the Chicago post office and some of the carriers have been equipped with roller skates in the belief that the innovation will result in greater speed in the transaction of routine business and the elimination of considerable effort in walking. An article in a recent issue of Popular Mechanics Magazine told of the use of roller skates by stockroom employes in a large factory, and this suggested their use in the postal service. The post-office check room is in the basement and has a series of rooms of concrete floor space 300 ft. long. Here the clothing, uniforms, hats, and shoes of 1,400 clerks are hung and the running back and forth amounts to several miles every day. Several pairs of roller skates were bought and given to the employes in the check room. It was soon found that they did their work with less effort and in one-third of the time it had taken them to run back and forth. The roller skates proved so great an aid on the inside that the postmaster decided to experiment further, and several of the special parcel-post carriers were also equipped with skates.

SINKING OF THE "EMPRESS OF IRELAND."

In spite of the fact that the vessel was equipped with lifeboats, had more than enough lifeboats to carry all of the 1,437 persons on board, was built with watertight bulkheads, and had apparently every other modern facility for the safety of its passengers, more than 900 persons lost their lives when the Canadian-Pacific liner "Empress of Ireland," bound from Montreal to Liverpool, was rammed and sunk by the Norwegian collier "Starstad" on May 29, 1914, in the estuary that forms the mouth of the St. Lawrence River. A number of views in the July Popular Mechanics Magazine show how the accident occurred. The appalling loss of life was caused by the rapidity with which the ship filled and sank, the time being estimated at from 10 to 17 minutes, and in this brief period there was no time for launching the lifeboats or for any organized work of rescue.

FARMING IMPLEMENT THAT GUIDES ITSELF.

One of the latest innovations in farming implements is a gasoline-driven vehicle that guides itself around the field and needs no attention except to be started and stopped at the right points. This vehicle, which is described, with illustration, in the July Popular Mechanics Magazine, travels in a constantly narrowing circle and is so designed that any of the devices used in row-crop farming, such as plows, ridgers, cultivators or sprayers, may be readily attached to it. In order to use the implement, it is necessary to abandon the usual rectangular form of field with straight rows and adopt a circular rows spiraling toward the center. The method is not adapted to big farms, but is intended for truck gardening and for farming on a small scale where the expense of employing an operator for the machine would be prohibitive.
