

**DEMONSTRATION FARM
WILL BE AT HOPE.**

On Wednesday morning Hon. Robert F. Broussard, accompanied by Prof. B. H. Rowls of the Bureau of Animal Industry of the United States Department of Agriculture and Prof. Dodson of the State Experimental Farm visited Hope Penal Farm near Jeanerette for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not it would be acceptable for the use of the Live Stock Demonstration Farm of the Parish which appropriation of \$60,000 was made by Congress at the instance of Congressman Broussard. The movement for the Farm was started by Mayor Fontelieu and the New Iberia Chamber of Commerce some months since with the intention of having it placed as near New Iberia as was feasible and within easy access of our farmers throughout the Parish. There were present the entire Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce who attended the conference for the purpose of trying to dissuade the committee, consisting of the Congressman from accepting the States' offer of five hundred acres of land as a bonus. The meeting was called to order by Mr. Edwin Estorge, the President who asked Mr. Broussard to outline what decision they had arrived at relative to the site. Mr. Broussard said that the original bill as introduced by him had met with considerable opposition in the committee and he had written to Senator Burke suggesting that the State Legislature offer 500 acres of Hope Farm situated about two and a half miles from Jeanerette and stating that this would secure the Farm for Louisiana. The \$60,000 appropriation could be used exclusively for stocking the farm and for the building of barns and silos. After concluding his remarks, Mr. Broussard then asked Mr. Rowls to outline the work which would be undertaken on the Farm and its advantages to our people. The gentleman went into detail and elaborated how demonstration farms are arranged and showed with what system experiments are made, not only in raising forage crops but how stock was raised to bring about the best results which was very instructive and interesting to those who listened to him. He said, however, that before Hope Farm is selected it was up to the Parish authorities to get busy and rid the Parish of tick, cholera and charbon and that it would be an animal and not an agricultural demonstration farm.

While there are a great many interested in the propaganda of live stock in this Parish we believe more of our farmers are interested in scientific and diversified farming and this feature of the undertaking will be a disappointment to some. Prof. Dodson the next speaker stated that the tick could be eradicated in this Parish at the cost of not more than \$500 as Iberia was not a badly infested Parish. It was the sense of those present that a general mass meeting be held here on Tuesday, August the 25th to meet the same gentlemen who will discuss the organization of a tick eradication movement. This is essential if we hope to see the Government authorities plant the Demonstration Farm here and we understand Dr. Goodwin has launched a movement for a Live Stock Sanitary Board who will strive to carry on the work successfully once it is begun.

2,000 GERMAN LOSS; FIGHTING IS TERRIFIC.
Brussels, Aug. 13.—Hasselt, in the Province of Limburg, was thrice taken by German troops and three times recaptured by Belgians. According to war office advices, the fighting began early yesterday morning. The Belgians were said to have completely repulsed the German flanking movement at one of the encounters. Ten thousand cavalry were engaged on both sides. The German force comprised the Second cavalry division.

The Belgians now hold Hasselt, having inflicted heavy losses on the invaders.
Brussels (via London), Aug. 13, 6:05 P. M.—According to Le Soir the German casualties during yesterday's fighting in the vicinity of Haelen totaled about 2,000, equally divided between killed and wounded. The Belgian casualties are not precisely known, but are declared to be only a few dead and wounded.

London, Aug. 13.—Earl Kitchener, British secretary of state for war, today notified the press that any newspaper publishing news of naval or military movements except that issued by the official bureau would be suspended.

Brussels (via London), Aug. 13.—Belgian official communication today says that a German force proceeding in the direction of Eghezee to the north of Namur was attacked and repulsed this morning by the Belgian troops. The Germans suffered severe casualties. The Belgians captured a number of machine guns mounted on motor cars.

Brussels, via London, Aug. 13.—An official communication issued today confirms yesterday's success of the Belgian troops over the Germans at Haelen. It says the German casualties were very heavy, three-fifths of their troops engaged in the encounter being killed or wounded, while the Belgian casualties are reported as relatively small.

Brussels, Aug. 13.—It was officially announced this afternoon that the German advance toward Namur has been checked by the Belgian-French forces at Eghezee.
The war office claims that the German losses are enormous, and that the Belgians have captured several latest model German machine guns mounted on automobile trucks.
It is stated that the Belgian forces did not wait for the Germans to attack, but took the offensive, and in a series of terrific charges drove the German advance back upon the reserves.
The Belgian cavalry, assisted by infantry and protected by artillery, moved so rapidly that the German plans were completely upset.
The accurate knowledge of the ground proved of inestimable value to the Belgian commanding officers.
Following a night of terror, in which German force attempted to break through the Belgian-French front, it was announced that the Belgian positions are maintained.
The fighting at a dozen points has been of the fiercest character. It is admitted by the war officials that the German assault on the Belgian positions where French and Belgians are fighting shoulder to shoulder, has been only begun.
Liege still holds out according to the war office although the bombardment with siege guns continues. A night assault in force on the upper forts was beaten off.
The Germans have bridged the Meuse and are moving their track artillery against the Belgian lines.

THE MEN WHO MADE EUROPE'S GREAT WAR.

All Europe was convulsed by the peremptory demands made by the Emperor Francis Joseph of Austria-Hungary on Serbia as a result of the assassination of the Archduke Francis Ferdinand. It was generally assumed that Germany was behind Austria. Serbia, determining that it was not consistent with her honor to meet Austria's demands, gave an unsatisfactory reply and looked to Russia to defend her. The Czar accepted the implied challenge of Austria and Germany, and the efforts of Great Britain and France to avert war were unsuccessful. The responsibility may justly be placed upon the three war lords of Europe, the only Emperors in the civilized world whose power approached that of absolute monarchs. Austria declared war against Serbia, on July 28th. On August 1st, Germany declared war on Russia, alleging the mobilization of Russian troops on the German frontier. Immediately Germany marched through neutral states upon France, Russia's ally, with three armies. At that time no declaration of war had been made by either country. Each wished to throw the blame of the formal declaration on the other, but August 4th Germany declared that a state of war with France existed and claimed to the world that the latter country had been the aggressor. The advance through Luxemburg and Belgium, in violation of treaties, was construed by Great Britain as a challenge from Germany. The reason for this violation of neutral states is found in the fact that France is less strongly fortified on their frontiers.
