NO INSTANCES OF ATROCITIES.

New York, Sept. 8.—Four well known American newspaper men and magazine writers, in a message received here yesterday, declare they have seen no instances of German atrocities unprovoked after having spent two weeks with their troops, accompanying them upwards of 100 miles. The text of the message was mutilated in transmission but the contents were interpreted as follows:

"In spirit we unite in rendering (sic) German atrocities groundless as far as we are able to. After spending two weeks with and accompanying the troops upward of 100 miles, we are unable to report a single instance unprovoked. We also are unable to confirm rumors of mistreatment to prisoners or of non-combatants with the German columns. This is true, of Louvain, Brussels, Luneville and Nantes, while in Prussian hands. We visited Chateau Soldre, Samble and Beaumont without substantiating a single wanton brutality. Numerous investigated rumors proved groundless. Everywhere we have seen Germans paying for purchases and respecting property rights, as well as according civilians every consideration.

"After the battle of Biass (probably Barse, a suburb of Nancy) we found Belgian women and children moving comfortably about. The day after the Germans had captured the town in Merbes Chateau, we found one citizen killed, but were unable to confirm lack of provocation. Refugees with stories of atrocities were unable to supply direct evidence. Belgians in the Samble Valley discounted reports of cruelty in the surrounding countries. The discipline of the German soldiers is excellent, as we observed. To the truth of these statements we pledge our professional and personal word.

Pursuant to the provisions of an ordinance duly passed by the Board of School Directors of the Parish of Iberia, La., at a special meeting held on the 21st day of August, 1914, I, Paul N. Cyr, President of said Board, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said ordinance, a special election will be held in School District Number Five, of Iberia Parish, La., on the 22d day of September, 1914, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers, qualified, under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition, to-wit:

To levy a special tax of two (2) mills on the dollar on all taxable property in School District Number Five, of Iberia Parish, La., subject to State taxation, annually, for a period of five (5) years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools within said district; said tax to be levied and collected for the years 1914, 1915, 1916, 1917 and 1918, inclusive.

For the purpose of said election, the polling place will be at the Coteau School House, within said district, and Messrs. Sidney Norres, Arthur LeBlanc and Eugene Fremin have been appointed commissioners, and Mr. Henry Landry has been appointed clerk of said election.

At said election, the polls will open at seven o'clock A. M., and close at five o'clock P. M., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

At said election, the following form of ballot will be used, to-wit:
