

Official Minutes Board of Trustees.

New Iberia, Dec. 7, 1914.
The Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia convened this day with Mayor Alphe Fontelieu presiding and Messrs. Villermin and Suberbielle present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on motion of Mr. Fontelieu, seconded by Mr. Villermin.

A final vote on Ordinance No. 53 relative to the City Bridge and its approaches resulted in the following Yea and Nay vote: Yea, Mr. Fontelieu, Suberbielle and Villermin; Nay, none.

The following petition was presented and on motion of Mr. Suberbielle, seconded by Mr. Fontelieu was turned over to the City Attorney with instructions to, have an Act drawn and the signatures of said signers affixed thereto for recordation with the Clerk of Court

State of Louisiana, Parish of Iberia.

We, the undersigned, owners of property situated on either sides of a certain lane running down from the Bayou Teche to the rear, separating our properties, do hereby consent to donate and deliver to the City of New Iberia a strip of land along our front on each side of said lane as a public street or highway, all of which is situated on the east side of the Bayou Teche.

Messrs. Fontelieu and Villermin reported to the Board that after a partial inspection of baker shops a final inspection was ordered for Thursday, Dec. 10th, those places not up to the standard of cleanliness at the said date will be prosecuted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Villermin, seconded by Mr. Fontelieu and carried by the following Yea and Nay vote: Yea, Mr. Fontelieu, Suberbielle and Villermin; Nay, none.

Be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia that a daily report be kept of the test of the Fire Alarm System of the City of New Iberia, in book form for reference as recommended by the Louisiana Fire Prevention Bureau, that the Mayor appoint some responsible party to make test and enter them in the record book.

On motion of Mr. Fontelieu, seconded by Mr. Villermin and carried, Mr. Simon Lassalle was instructed to make the test and keep record book on file in the office of the Electric Light and Water Works Plant.

Mr. Villermin asked permission to install 100 Candle Power street lights at the following corners, the approximate cost being \$250.00, to be taken out of the Bond fund. On motion of Mr. Suberbielle, seconded by Mr. Fontelieu the permission was granted.

Corner Dale and French, corner of Dale and Walnut or Walton street, corner Bayou and Williams, corner East Main St.,

and Jefferson Terrace, corner E. Madison and Prairie Ave., corner Marie, rear Pollard Ave.

ORDINANCE NO. 54.

The following ordinance was introduced by Mr. Fontelieu, seconded by Mr. Suberbielle and carried unanimously.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia that cement sidewalks and curbs be built and constructed over and along the following streets to-wit:

Upper Main Street, both sides from Chestnut street to corporate limits.

Chestnut street, both sides from Main to Jane Street.

Hopkins street from Washington to Field street, both sides.

Corinne street from Washington to Field street, both sides.

Iberia street from Washington street to Dale, both sides.

Julia street from Washington street to Dale, both sides.

Weeks street from Washington street to Hacker, both sides.

Centre street from Washington street to Dale, both sides.

Philip street south side from Main street to Bayou Teche.

Lower Main street south side from rescent terminus to Lewis Ave.

Lower Main street, North side from Lewis Ave., to Corporate limits.

French street, from Washington street to Madison street both sides.

The entire amount of concrete sidewalks to be constructed aggregate about 104,750 square feet and about 33,900 lineal feet of curb.

Be it further ordained, that notice be given in the official newspaper for at least ten days, by the Board of Trustees, asking for bids for the building and construction of said sidewalks and curbs.

Be it further ordained that this contract to do and perform this work be awarded to the lowest successful bidder who can give satisfactory bond for the completion of the same, according to plans and specifications on file in the office of Trustees of Public Safety.

Said security to be for twenty-five (25) per cent of the contract price.

The material to be used together with all details concerning the same is made to fully and accurately appear by the plans and specifications thereof on file in the office of Trustees of Public Safety, which are herein incorporated in the ordinance and made part thereof, and are available for Public Inspection.

Be it further ordained, that each of the abutting property owners owning property along said streets, shall be taxed with the entire cost of the construction of said sidewalks and curbing abutting his property, one-fifth of which amount is to be payable cash within ten days from the completion and acceptance of said work by the City, and the balance to be payable in five equal installments, payable One, two, Three, Four and Five years, from date of the issuance of Cer-

Be it further ordained, that bids are hereby sought for the construction of this work, under and in conformity with Act 147 of 1902 as amended by Act 49 of 1912 and Act 187 of 1910 (The City Charter) and that the Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia reserves the right to reject any and all bids.


