TAX ORDINANCE.

On motion of Mr. Landry, seconded
by Mr. Druilhet and carried,
the following Tax Ordinance
for a period of thirty days:

Sec. 1. Be it resolved and or-
dained by the Police Jury of Iberia
Parish, in regular session as-
sembled, that the budget as sub-
mitted by the Finance Commit-
tee, be and the same is hereby
adopted as the budget of receipts
and disbursements of the Parish
for the year 1915.

Sec. 2. Be it further resolved
and ordained, etc., that for the
year 1915, there are hereby levied
Parish Taxes aggregating ten
mills on the dollar of the as-
sessed valuation of all real estate
and all the improvements of
whatever kind thereto attached;
on all manufacturing plants; on
all telephones lines and telegraph
lines; on all railroads together
with their equipments and rolling
stock; on all steam boats and
water crafts of all kinds; on all
automobiles, cars, carriages, wa-
gons, buggies, carts or other
vehicles; on all horses, mules,
cattle, hogs, sheep or other ani-
mals; on all lumber, brick or other
building material; on all goods,

wares, merchandise and other
stock in trade; on all personal
property, on all cash on hand or
on deposit; on all movable and
immovable property of any kind
owned or held in trust by any
person, persons or association of
persons within the Parish of Iberia
and outside the corporate limits
of the towns of New Iberia,
Jeanerette, Delcambre and Lore-
auville.

Sec. 3. Be it further resolved
and ordained, etc., that on all
property enumerated in Sec. 2 of
this ordinance and situated with-
in the corporate limits of the
towns of New Iberia, Jeanerette,
Delcambre and Loreauville; there
are hereby levied taxes aggregat-
ing four mills on the dollar of the
assessed valuation thereof, for
criminal and school purposes and
for the maintenance fund of the
Court House and jail building and
grounds surrounding same.

Sec. 4. Be it further resolved
and ordained, etc., that for the
purpose of providing the funds
necessary to pay the bonus voted
to the New Iberia-Northern Rail-
road Company by the Fourth and
Sixth Wards of the Parish of Iberia,
a special tax of 5 mills on the
dollar is hereby levied on the as-
sessed valuation of all the prop-
erty enumerated in Section 2 of
this Ordinance and situated in
said Fourth and Sixth Wards, ex-
clusive of the property situated
within the corporate limits of the
City of New Iberia.

LICENSE TAX ORDINANCE.

Mr. Romero submitted the fol-
lowing License Tax Ordinance,
which was on his motion, seconded
by Mr. Landry, approved by
section. Mr. Gates recorded a
negative vote on Section 4 and
offered as an amendment that li-
cense on circuses be placed at
\$150.00 when employing 100 peo-
ple or more; and \$75.00 when em-
ploying less than 100 people.
This amendment was defeated
and the ordinance as written or-
dered printed in the Official
Journal for a period of thirty
days:

Sec. 1. Be it resolved and or-
dained by the Police Jury of Iberia
Parish, in regular session as-
sembled, that a tax license for
the year 1915, is hereby levied on
all persons, firms, corporations,
professions, trades, vocations or
business occupations enumerated
below in the Parish of Iberia and
outside the corporate limits of

the towns of New Iberia, Jeaner-
ette, Loreauville and Del-
cambre:

Sec. 2. That for bar-room,
carriage, coffee house, cafe, grog
shop, beer garden or any other
place where distilled alcoholic
beverages, made or any other kind of
liquor is sold within the Parish
of Iberia, the annual license shall
be \$1000.00

Sec. 3. That for any bar-
room, dance hall or other place
of amusement where an admit-
tance fee is charged, either di-
rectly or indirectly, or where re-
freshments are sold, the annual
license shall be \$10.00

Sec. 4. That for any circus or
traveling show, the annual license
shall be as follows, viz: When
employing 100 persons or more
\$100.00; when employing less than
100 persons \$50.00.

Sec. 5. That for the conduct
of a retail business by any one,
either as principal or agent, the
annual license shall be as follows,
viz:

1st Class, when the gross sales
shall be \$25,000 or more \$25.00
2d Class, when the gross sales
shall be not less than \$20,000.00
nor over \$25,000, \$20.00.
3rd Class, when the gross sales
shall be not less than \$15,000 nor
over \$20,000, \$15.00.
4th Class, when the gross sales
shall be not less than \$5,000 nor
over \$15,000, \$10.00.
5th Class, when the gross sales
shall be \$5,000 or less, \$5.00.

Provided that if any distilled,
vinous, malt, alcoholic or other
liquor be sold in connection with
any retail business or with ball
rooms or dance halls, then the li-
cense provided in Section 2 of
this ordinance shall be charged in
addition to the above schedule.

Sec. 6. That each peddler or
hawker shall pay a license for
the year 1915 as follows, viz:

1st. When traveling in any
boat or water craft, \$250.00.
2d. When traveling in an au-
tomobile or any other self-prop-
elling vehicle, \$250.00.
3rd. When traveling in a two
horse vehicle, \$100.00.
4th. When traveling in a one
horse vehicle, \$75.00.
5th. When traveling on horse
back, \$60.00.
6th. When traveling on foot,
\$50.00.

Sec. 7. That for every auto-
mobile, auto truck, motor cycle
or other self-propelling vehicles
kept within the limits of Iberia
Parish, and outside the corporate
limits of New Iberia, Jeanerette,
Delcambre and Loreauville, an
annual license tax is hereby levied
as follows:

When with a seating capacity
of 7 or over \$7.00.
When with a seating capacity
of not less than 5 nor over 7, \$5.00.
When with a seating capacity
of not less than two nor over five,
\$3.00.

For motor trucks or freight ear-
rying automobiles, \$5.00.
For motor cycles, \$2.00.

Sec. 8. Be it further resolved
and ordained, etc., that the
Sheriff or Tax Collector shall issue
to each peddler or hawker,
only upon a permit issued by the
Secretary of the Police Jury who
shall deliver to the applicant for
license a metal plate bearing the
legend, "License Plate, 1915,"
which plate shall be conspicuously
displayed on the left hand out-
side of the vehicle for which it
is issued, or in cases where horse-
back or foot peddling is pursued,
than in such cases, the persons
thus engaged shall carry the
plate above provided for on
their persons and shall produce
same on the demand of any duly
qualified officer of the Parish.

Sec. 9. Be it further resolved
and ordained, etc., that all li-
censes herein provided for shall be
due and payable on the 1st day
of January, 1915, and that unless
paid on or before the first day of
March, 1915, shall be declared to
be delinquent.

Provided however that the Tax
Collector be and that he is here-
by authorized and directed to
issue one-half licenses to each per-
son and firms who wish to en-
gage in business for the last six
months of the year, or any
part thereof, at one-half the
amount specified above; save and
except circuses or shows and ped-
dlers or hawkers licenses which
shall be for the full amount men-
tioned whether the calling be en-
gaged in for the full term of one
year or only for a part thereof.

Sec. 10. Be it further resolved
and ordained, etc., that it shall
be the duty of the Tax Collector
to furnish the Police Jury, at its
regular meeting of the month of
March 1915, a full list of all de-
linquent and unpaid licenses.
