

Official Minutes Board of Trustees.

New Iberia, La., Feb. 8, 1915.
The Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia, La., convened this day in Regular Meeting with Mayor Alphe Fontelieu presiding, and Messrs. J. Paul Suberbielle and L. F. Villermin present.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read, and on motion of Mr. L. F. Villermin, seconded by Mr. Suberbielle, were approved.

On the day and at the time appointed for the opening of the bids for the construction of cement sidewalks, curbs, etc., as per advertisement in the New Iberia Enterprise, the following bids were received and opened, in open meeting, to-wit:

H. S. Sealy—Curb, 18 in. 39c; Curb, each ad. inch 3 1-2c; Sidewalk \$12.85; 6 in. pipe, 25c; 10 in. pipe 55c; Excavation 40c; Wooden Crossings \$35.00; Reinforced concrete 70c.
Williams Bros. & Payne—Curb, 18 in. 39c; Curb, ad. inch 3c; Sidewalk \$14.90; 6 in. pipe 25c; 10 in. pipe 60c; Excavation 45c; Wooden Crossings \$40.00; Reinforced concrete 55c.
DeJersey & Naff—Curb, 18 in. 30c; Curb, each ad. inch 3c; Sidewalk \$11.90; 6 in. pipe 40c; Excavation 50c; Wooden Crossings \$30.00; Reinforced concrete 60c.
J. B. Jenkins & Co.—Curb, 18 in. 37c; Curb, ad. inch 2 1-2c; Sidewalk \$12.50; 6 in. pipe 20c; 10 in. pipe 35c; Excavation 32c; Wooden Crossings \$35.00; Reinforced concrete 60c.

And it being found that the bid of DeJersey and Naff, of the City of Opelousas, Louisiana, was the lowest responsible bidder, it was

Resolved and Ordained, that the bid of DeJersey and Naff, be, and is hereby accepted and all the other bids hereinabove recumulated be, and they are hereby rejected, on motion of Mr. Suberbielle, seconded by Fontelieu and carried unanimously.

It is further ordained, that his Honor, Alphe Fontelieu, Mayor of the City of New Iberia, be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to enter into a contract with the said successful bidder, for the construction of said cement sidewalks, etc., and to accept bond as required by ordinance of this City.

The said firm of DeJersey and Naff being allowed one hundred and fifty (150) working days within which to complete said work, from the time fixed for the said contractor to begin work, as specified in the specifications.

Dr. E. S. Fulton reported to the Board that the Small Pox patient was doing well and that there was no new case.

On motion of Mr. Villermin, seconded by Mr. Suberbielle the contract entered into between the City of New Iberia and Messrs. H. S. Sealy be spread on the minutes.

That the said Contractor has agreed, and does by these presents agree, for the consideration herein mentioned and contained and under the consideration and conditions to furnish at his own expense and cost all the necessary material and labor to excavate and build in a good firm and substantial manner. A Filtered water receiving and storage basin of reinforced concrete, complete including steel reinforcing. A Filter unit of reinforced concrete, complete including steel reinforcing. Tank foundations of Mass Concrete, 1, 3, 6. Extra reinforced concrete that may be required as provided for in paragraph 15 item No. 1 complete and of the dimensions, in the manner and under the conditions herein specified, under the supervision and directions of the City Engineer of this City, or his legal representative; the whole in strict accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the Commissioner of Public Safety of this City, a certified copy whereof is hereto attached and made part hereof as completely as if written at length, and herewith identified by neral paragraph ne varietur, copy of bid of contractor is also attached and made part hereof, also identified herewith.

The contractor also binds himself to take out policy of insurance as per act No. 20 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of 1,14, for the protection of his employees, in compensation for such injuries as they might receive in the performance of the services which they may be performing for said contractor, under this contract, and to hold the City free from any responsibility therefor, and in consideration of the faithful and complete performance by the contractor of all and singular, the obligations herein assumed by said contractor, the Honorable Alphe Fontelieu, Mayor of said City and on its behalf hereby agrees to pay unto the said contractor, his heirs and legal representatives or assigns at the time and in the manner set forth in the specifications and bid and the plans hereinafove mentioned the price bid of said contractor, as accepted by resolution of the Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia, hereinabove referred to, a copy hereof is hereto attached.

It is well understood that item No. 5, paragraph 49 "Water proofing interior of suction well, and item 5, paragraph 51" Alternative for making suction well, water tight, of plan and specifications and contractors bid hereto attached do not form part of the work to be made, as they are optional with said City whether or not it will be made.

The conditions of this contract are further that the said contractor shall furnish to the City of New Iberia a good and acceptable bond in a sum equal to twenty-five per cent. of the amount of the said bid conditioned to secure the City for the faithful performance of said work and to hold the City free from any obligations for the price of material used and the price for the work done. The said Contractor having exhibited to the members of the Board of Trustees of this City a policy of the insurance mentioned herein for the protection of the laborers and other employees, under Act 20 of 1914.
