## Official Minutes Board of Trustees.

New Iberia, May 17th, 1915. The Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia convened this day with Mayor Alphe Fontenot absent. J. Paul Suberbielle, acting Mayor and Villerman present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on motion of Mr. Villerman, seconded by Mr. Suberbielle.

On motion of Mr. Suberbielle, seconded by Mr. Villerman, the following resolution was ordered:

Whereas, the City of New Iberia is indebted to the Fabrice Fire Hose Company in the sum of Two Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars, balance on purchase of hose, this firm is desirous of closing account with note, therefore:

Be it Resolved, That the Acting Mayor of the City of New Iberia be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to execute note of the City in favor of said firm in the amount named, said note to mature March 16, 1916 and conditioned to bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from date until paid.

On motion of Mr. Suberbielle, seconded by Mr. Villerman, the following resolution was ordered:

Whereas, the City of New Iberia is indebted to the Eureka Fire Hose Company in the sum of Two Hundred and Forty Nine 50-100 Dollars, balance on purchase of hose, this firm is desirous of closing account with note:

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Acting Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to execute note of the City of New Iberia in the amount named in favor of said firm, said note to mature March 1, 1916 and conditioned to bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from May 5th, 1915 until paid.

It is the intention to give a series of balls, parties, lunches, etc. and right now is the time for all who wish to take part in these social matters to come in.
