

THE SACRIFICE OF THE ASSESSORS.

At an executive conference between Governor Hall and members of the house appropriations and senate finance committees Wednesday, an agreement was reached to amend the general appropriation bill so that money for the state institutions takes precedence over state officials. This was accomplished by writing into the bill a new order for the payment of warrants against the general fund.

The salaries for state officials will be put last on the list of items against which warrants shall be cashed. The assessors will be the hardest hit under the arrangement.

Governor Hall told the committee that, in view of the \$366,000 excess appropriation carried in the bill, some arrangements for the protection of the institutional wards of the state became necessary.—News Item in The Shreveport Times of 3rd.

To the average reader the above news item will convey very little and certainly not create a feeling of outrage and resentment in him, but when he knows the full history of a certain piece of highhandedness on the part of the Governor, we will not be surprised to find him figuratively pulling his hair and making the air blue.

It will be remembered that the Governor vetoed certain items in the appropriation bill at the regular session last year, necessitating the call of this special session to make necessary provision for the State. Practically all the eleemosynary institutions in the State came under the paring knife of the Governor and were cut out of the appropriation bill; and, along with them the country assessors. This does not seem very strange just yet why the country assessors and no other officers of the State should have been left out of the money bill without pay for 1915, but it comes out now as the beginning of a very fine scheme.

It will be noticed in the news item that at an executive conference between the Governor and the house appropriation and senate finance committees it was decided to amend the general appropriation bill of this special session, which is taking care of those left out in the general appropriation bill of the regular session of 1914, so that money for the state institutions takes precedence over state officials. There are no state officers to take precedence over except the country assessors; all the others were taken care of in the appropriation bill of 1914.

The Governor fixes it so that the assessors can not get pay for their services until after everybody else entitled to state money has gotten his. This is to force the assessors in the country to raise the assessment in the country parishes to an amount sufficient to make up a deficit of \$366,000.00, which the present appropriation bill carries. Governor Hall is trying to force the country assessors, by making them wait until everybody else is served out of the state treasury, raise the assessment sufficient to provide revenues to take care of an extravagant, broken-down and bankrupt administration.

At the last session the Governor sought to have a bill passed by the legislature requiring the assessors to list all property at full value and make any assessor who failed to do so subject to removal from office. The assessors fought this bill and it was killed. Now the Governor goes after them from another angle to make them do his bidding by putting up to them the question, assess sufficient to pay the debts of my administration or starve, durn you.—The Richland Beacon-News.
