

Official Minutes Board of Trustees

New Iberia, Sept. 6th, 1915. The Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia convened this day with Mayor H. S. Sealy presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on motion of Mr. Villerman, seconded by Mr. Sealy.

On motion of Mr. Sealy, seconded by Mr. Villerman and carried unanimously the amount of \$5.00 payable monthly to account of O. E. Stansbury be discontinued due to the lack of funds.

On motion of Mr. Sealy, seconded by Mr. Villerman and carried unanimously the salary of the City Attorney was reduced from \$50.00 to \$35.00 per month.

On motion of Mr. Sealy, seconded by Mr. Suberbielle and carried unanimously the agreement with C. Louviere of June 24, 1913 for feeding prisoners was terminated.

The proposition of Mr. C. LeBlanc for feeding prisoners of the City placed in the Parish Jail was accepted and ordered filed.

New Iberia, Sept. 6, 1915. To the Honorable Commissioners of the Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia, La.:

Gentlemen—In answer to your request for an opinion on the possible amendment to the City Market Ordinance as in effect at present, I offer in my opinion I see no way wherein the market ordinance of this City could in any way be amended so as to bring on the relief requested in the petition from the butchers and vegetable dealers it would be illegal to adopt an ordinance preventing persons from dealing with markets outside of the prescribed limits, and there can be no way of preventing the owners of these markets from delivering the goods sold by them over their stalls.


On motion of Mr. Sealy, seconded by Mr. Villerman and carried there was ordered a railing placed in the office of Trustee of Finance.
