Negotiations have been opened with the Scandinavian-American line for the charter of the lines Oscar II. If the boat is secured it is proposed to start from New York December 4.

Sec. 1. Be it resolved and ordained by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, in regular session assembled, that the budget as submitted by the Finance Committee, and the same is hereby adopted as the Budget of Receipts and Disbursements of Iberia Parish for the year 1916.

Sec. 2. Be it further resolved and ordained, that for the year 1916, there are hereby levied Parish taxes, aggregating ten mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all real estate and on all improvements of whatever kind thereon, on all manufacturing plants, on all telephone lines and all telephone lines on all railroads together with their equipments and rolling stock, on all steamboats and water craft, on all automobiles, cars, trucks, motor cycles, carriages, buggies, wagons, carts, and other vehicles, on all horses, mules, cattle, hogs, sheep or other animals, on all mines, quarries, sand or gravel deposits, on all lumber, bricks or other building materials, on all goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles in trade, on all personal property, on all cash on hand or on deposit, on all movable and immovable property of any kind owned or held in trust by any person, person or corporation within the Parish of Iberia and outside the Corporate limits of the towns of New Iberia, Jeanerette, Loreauville and Delcambre.  
Sec. 3. **LICENSE ORDINANCE.**

Mr. Decourt submitted the following License Tax Ordinance which was on his motion, seconded by Mr. Jacob, approved by Section and ordered printed in the Official Journal for a period of thirty days as provided by law.

Sec. 1. Be it resolved and ordained by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, in regular session assembled, that a license tax for the year 1916 is hereby levied on all persons, firms, corporations, professions, trades, vocations or business occupations enumerated below, in the Parish of Iberia and outside the Corporate limits of the towns of New Iberia, Jeanerette, Loreauville and Delcambre.

Sec. 2. That for all bar room, cabaret, coffee house, cafe, grog shop, beer garden, or any place where distilled, alcoholic, vinous, malt or any other kind of liquor is sold within the Parish, and outside the Corporate limits of the towns of New Iberia, Jeanerette, Loreauville and Delcambre, the annual license shall be \$1000.00.

Sec. 3. That for any dance hall ball room or other place of amusement where an admittance fee is charged, either directly or indirectly; or where refreshments are sold, the annual license shall be \$10.00.

Sec. 4. That for any circus or traveling show, the annual license shall be "a" when employing 100 persons or more \$100.00, (b) when employing less than 100 persons \$50.00.

Sec. 5. For the conduct of the retail business my any one, either as principal or agent, the annual license shall be \$25.00.

(a) when the gross sales shall be \$25,000 or more (b) when the gross sales shall be not less than \$20,000 nor more than \$25,000, \$20.00.

(c) when the gross sales shall be not less than \$15,000 nor more than \$20,000 (d) when the gross sales shall be not less than \$5,000 nor more than \$15,000, \$10.00.

(e) when the gross sales shall be \$5,000 or less, \$5.00.

Provided however, that if any distilled, alcoholic, vinous, malt or other liquor be sold in connection with the retail business, or with dance rooms or ball rooms, then the license provided for in Section 2 of this ordinance shall be charged in addition to the above schedule.

Sec. 6. That each peddler or hawker shall pay a license for the year 1916 as follows, viz:

(a) When traveling in any boat or water craft \$250.00.

(b) When traveling in an automobile or any other self-propelling vehicle \$250.00.

(c) When traveling in a two horse vehicle \$100.00.

(d) When traveling in a one horse vehicle \$75.00.

(e) When traveling on horse back \$60.00.

(f) When traveling on foot, \$50.00.

Sec. 7. Be it further resolved etc., that the Sheriff or Tax Collector shall issue a license to each hawker or peddler, only upon a permit issued by the Secretary of the Police Jury, who shall deliver to the applicant for a license, a metal plate, bearing the legend "License Tax, Iberia Parish, La., 1916" which plate shall be conspicuously displayed on the left hand, outside of the vehicle is pursued, then in such cases, the person or persons thus engaged for which it is issued, or in cases where horse-back or foot peddling shall carry the plate above provided for on their person, and shall produce same on the demand of any duly authorized officer of the Parish.

Sec. 8. That for every automobile, auto truck, motor cycle or other self-propelling vehicle

kept within the Parish of Iberia and outside the Corporate limits of the towns of New Iberia, Jeanerette, Loreauville and Delcambre, an annual license is hereby levied as follows, viz:

(a) When with a seating capacity of 7 or more \$7.00.

(b) When with a seating capacity of not less than 5 or more than 7, \$5.00.

(c) When with a seating capacity of not less than 2 or more than 5, \$3.00.

(d) For motor trucks or freight carrying automobiles; (e) For motor cycles \$2.00.

Sec. 9. Be it further resolved and ordained, etc., that all licenses herein provided for shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January 1916, and that unless paid on or before the 1st day of March 1916, shall be declared to be delinquent.

Provided however, that the Tax Collector be and that he is hereby authorized and directed to issue one-half license to such persons or firms who wish to engage in business for the last six months of the year, or any part thereof, at one-half the amounts specified in the above and foregoing sections, save and excepted censes or traveling shows and peddlers or hawkers licenses which shall be for the full amount specified in Sections 4 and 6 of this ordinance, whether the calling be engaged in for the full term of one year or only for a part thereof.

Sec. 10. Be it further resolved and ordained, etc., that it shall be the duty of the Sheriff or Tax Collector to furnish the Police Jury at its regular meeting of the month of March 1916, a full list of all delinquent or unpaid licenses.

**Budget Ordinance No. 95**

The following budget was offered by Mr. Subordinate for 1916. An ordinance adopting the budget of the City of New Iberia, for the year ending December 31st, 1916, showing the aggregate sums and the warrants of all departments of the City Government, stating the amounts required to meet the interest on the outstanding indebtedness of the City and the warrants of all departments of the Municipal Government in detail, so as to specify the amount necessary to provide for the same, and also an estimate of the amount of income from taxes, licenses, water and light rents, and other sources of revenue, exclusive of taxes upon property and the probable amount required and raised by taxation to defray all expenses and liabilities of the City, as a basis for the purpose, at the proper time, of levying an annual tax in order to provide a revenue for the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1916.

Also to levy three mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all taxable property within the City of New Iberia, to pay the annual interest and a portion of the principal due on the Light and Water Bonds.

Also a special tax of three mills on the dollar on all taxable property within the limits of the New Iberia Northern Drainage District, to pay the annual interest and a portion of the principal of the debt contracted by the New Iberia Northern Drainage District.

Also a special tax of three and one-half mills on the dollar on all taxable property within the City of New Iberia, in aid of the New Iberia Northern Railroad Co. and with which to pay annual installment due in 1916.

Also a special tax of two mills on the dollar on all taxable property within the City of New Iberia, to pay the annual interest and a portion of the principal due on the Light and Water Bonds.
