



### BROUSSARD HAS 'NOTHING TO SAY.'

Not a single word on public affairs affecting the people of Louisiana could be coaxed or coaxed or wheedled out of United States Senator Robert Broussard Wednesday morning at the Southern Pacific wharf. The senator was about to sail on the Proteus for New York, en route for the most important session of the American Congress in recent years.

"I have nothing to say. Nothing at all. Not a thing," the State's junior representative in the United States Senate insisted emphatically even before a reporter of the States could put any specific questions.

The country is admittedly facing something approaching a crisis, the States man remembered and notwithstanding the discouraging senatorial utterance he asked Senator Broussard for some expression of opinion on the administration program in Washington.

"I have nothing to say," came the laconic reply and with a very slight indication of annoyance. The interview was not making a hit with the senator. The States man was having a novel experience with a public official, a public official with nothing to say—and all the strategic rules for interviewing recalcitrant dignitaries seemed to fall.

"But Senator, you will say something about the situation in the State. You will tell us where your sympathies are"—this from the newspaper man with all the naivete of a child asking for the moon.

Again the conversational closure rule was invoked by the senator:

"I have nothing to say."—States.

### THE FARM TENANT HAS BETTER ADVANTAGES THAN CITY LABORERS.

Remember this: The tenant is essentially a laborer, and when I contrast his condition with the conditions of other laborers in our great manufacturing plants and in the crowded slums of our great cities, where thousands of them are without employment today, their children hungry for bread—when I think of these things, I say, I am bound to rejoice in the greater freedom, opportunities, and possibilities of the rural laborer or renter in our Southern country. I am certainly not nearly so much depressed by any lack of opportunities for the white renters in the South today as I am by the failure of so many to take advantage of these opportunities.

Let's begin then, Brother Renter, by deciding that it's not such a bad thing to be a tenant farmer. As I have already intimated, few of them suffer for lack of food, as many ordinary laborers do; their are always periods when they may have rest and recreation such as other laborers hard-driven from year's end to year's end never enjoy; the parents can rear their children in God's open air and not have their bodies dwarfed by too early toil or their souls polluted by city slum life—and there is always the further chance that even though you are a renter, your boy may become a landowner. Already I have seen in our Southern towns tired-out little white boys and girls coming out of big factories at dusk, hirelings of great capitalists and with no prospect that they would ever be anything else, and I have wished that they might have the opportunities and possibilities of little Negro boys and girls playing out on the nearby farms.

No wonder the Negro leaders are thanking God that the factory doors are shut to their children. They are wise. The country is the place for the white renter to stay, no matter how dark the outlook may sometimes be.—The Progressive Farmer.


