**Ordinance No. 97.**

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia, La., convened in regular session, that it will be unlawful for any person or persons to turn in a False Fire Alarm, knowingly, intentionally, wantonly, or otherwise within the City of New Iberia.

Be it further ordained, that any person or persons convicted before the City Court, shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty five Dollars, nor more than Fifty Dollars, or imprisonment in the City jail, for not less than thirty days, nor more than sixty days, or both at the discretion of the Court.

All ordinances in conflict with the present Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Know all men by these presents that pursuant to an order issued out of the Honorable the 19th Judicial District Court in and for the Parish of Iberia, bearing date the 10th day of December A. D., 1915, we, the undersigned, P. J. Gaienne, Joseph Bonin, P. C. Romero and Jos. F. Moore, members of the Jury Commission for the said Parish and State duly and legally appointed, qualified and sworn according to law met at the office of the Clerk of Court for the Parish of Iberia, in the Parish Court House in the City of New Iberia, La., on the 20th day of December, A. Herpeche, two competent and disinterested witnesses, of lawful age and competent to read and write the English language, residents of the Parish of Iberia, and duly summoned for that purpose by the Clerk of Court, together with J. G.
