SUGGESTIONS ON HOG CHOLERA.

The Demonstration Department sends us the following ancient hog cholera:

"Since 9 per cent of the deaths from infectious swine diseases may be attributed to hog cholera, it is clear that every farmer should be interested in preventing his hogs against this evil. It must be remembered that hog cholera is one of the most contagious of diseases, and that it is very hard to control even when every precaution is used. No progress in controlling this disease can be expected with the serum treatment alone. Only until we observe every precaution usually taken to prevent the contagious diseases of man can we hope to get rid of this plague that causes so much loss.

Every effort should be put forth to completely eradicate cholera from our Parish. This will be accomplished more readily by the individual efforts of all. Since so many of our people refuse to believe that the serum is a protection, it is necessary for those who do believe to use their influence to convince them that this is the only protection when the hogs are once exposed. Since we are able to get good serum, and it is possible to save at least 25 per cent of the hogs when their temperature is not too high, and all hogs that are vaccinated with temperature are usually immune for life.

While the serum treatment is good, it is very necessary to keep the hogs healthy and everything sanitary. Stagnant ponds in poorly drained hog lots, cold, damp sleeping quarters, filthy troughs, etc., are conditions which tend to lower the vitality of the hogs and make them more susceptible to the disease. For the reasons above named, many farmers suffer a great loss, even when serum is used.

Clean sleeping quarters, sanitary pens, etc., and a good tonic will keep the hogs in a healthy condition; and if they are exposed to the disease they will respond to treatment more readily and a larger per cent will be saved."
