The Secretary reported that he had gone to Houston, as instructed by the Jury, to close the matter of sale of \$40,000.00 Parish Bonds with the Commonwealth Trust Co., whose bid of 101 for the issue had been accepted at the meeting held on December 28th, 1915; and that he had found that the Commonwealth Trust Co. was unable to carry out its contract and wished to be released.

It was moved by Mr. Romero, seconded by Mr. Jacob and carried, that the action of the Jury of December 28th, 1915, accepting the bid of the Commonwealth Trust Co. for the Bond Issue of \$40,000.00 be rescinded and the Commonwealth Trust Co. be released from the obligations incurred by its bid.

The following corrected Budget of Receipts and Expenditures of the Parish for the year 1916, was submitted by Mr. Romero and was on his motion, seconded by Mr. Jacob and unanimously carried, adopted as the Budget of Receipts and Expenditures for the Parish for the year 1916, in lieu of the Budget adopted at the meeting of the Jury held on the 5th day of November, 1915.

Mr. Romero presented and read the following ordinance and moved its adoption, which was seconded by Mr. Jacob, and said motion then there being put to a vote of "Ayes and Nays" and the roll being called, said ordinance was unanimously adopted. All members of the Jury voting "Yea" and there being no votes "Nay" which ordinance is in the words and figures as follows, to-wit:

the issuance of \$40,000.00 Bonds of said Parish for the purpose of constructing highways and public buildings, and providing that the principal and interest of said Bonds be payable out of the residue of the ten mill tax authorized by Article 232 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Whereas, it has been and is hereby found and determined by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana, that the levy of the full ten (10) mill tax, authorized by Article 232 of the Constitution of Louisiana, will be more than sufficient to pay all of the statutory and ordinary charges of said Parish, in and for the years 1916 to 1925 inclusive, and that for the years 1916 and 1917 nine (9) mills, and for the years 1918 to 1925 eight and one-half (8½) mills for the years 1924 and 1925 both inclusive eight (8) mills will be available for said purposes, and that residue of one (1) mill for each of the years 1916 and 1917, and one and one-half (1½) mills for the years 1918 to 1923 both inclusive, and two (2) mills for the years 1924 and 1925 both inclusive will be available for all other lawful purposes; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana, the above named tax will be available for any of the purposes provided for by Section 4 of Article 281 of the Constitution of Louisiana, over and above the tax which is hereby ascertained will be needed for the payment of all statutory and ordinary charges in the said years 1916 to 1925 inclusive; and

Whereas, it has been and is hereby also determined by the Police Jury of said Parish that it is necessary to borrow the sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars for the purpose of constructing highways, public buildings and making other general Parish improvements, and to issue bonds in the amount of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5 p. c.) per annum, both principal and interest of which shall be payable out of the excess of the ten (10) mill tax authorized by Article 232 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana; and

Whereas, all conditions precedent to the lawful issuance of said bonds required by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana have been fully complied with and said bonds have been sold at a price not less than par value thereof;

Now Therefore, Be It Ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana:

That there shall be annually levied in each of the years 1916 to 1925 both inclusive, the full tax of ten (10) mills on the dollar of all taxable property within the Parish as authorized to be levied by Article 232 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, of which ten (10) mill tax the following has been and is hereby appropriated and ordered to be devoted to the payment of all statutory and ordinary charges:

1916 and 1917	9 mills
1918 to 1923 both inclusive	8½ mills
1924 and 1925	8 mills

and that a sufficient part of the said remaining mills, as follows, on the dollar valuation of the taxable property of said Parish, is hereby irrevocably dedicated, appropriated and pledged to the payment of the principal and interest of the bonds authorized to be issued by this ordinance and to be payable in each of the years 1916 to 1925 inclusive:

1916 and 1917 both inc.	1 mill available
1918 to 1923 both inc.	1½ mill available
1924 and 1925 both inc.	2 mill available

as hereinafter provided, and to create a sinking fund to pay the principal of the bonds at maturity;

Be It Further Ordained, by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana, that for the purpose of constructing highways, public buildings and other general Parish improvements as authorized by Article 281 of the Constitution, and in anticipation of the collection of the avails of the tax hereinbefore levied there shall be and there is hereby ordered and directed to be issued negotiable coupon bonds of the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, in the total sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00); said bonds shall be Eighty (80) in number, numbered from one to eighty (1-80) both inclusive, shall be in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each and shall mature and become payable serially as follows, to-wit:

said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent (5 per cent.) per annum payable semi annually on the first days of January and July of each year, and shall have coupons attached representing said interest installments, both principal and interest shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the Banking House of the Central Trust Company of Illinois in the City of Chicago, Ill.

Be It Further Ordained, that said bonds and coupons shall be in substantially the following form, with the necessary variations to indicate the different numbers, maturities of principal and interest installments, to-wit:

Know All Men by These Presents, That the Parish of Iberia, in the State of Louisiana, acknowledges itself to owe and for avue received, hereby promises to pay bearer the sum of

19— together with interest on said sum from the date hereof until paid at the rate of five per cent (5 per cent.) per annum payable semi annually on the first days of January and July of each year commencing with July 1st, 1916 upon presentation and surrender of the annexed interest coupons as they severally become due; each principal and interest hereof are payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the Banking House of the Central Trust Company of Illinois, in the City of Chicago, Illinois.

This Bond is one of a series of Bonds of like date, and tender assent for the purpose of providing funds for the construction of highways, public buildings and other general Parish improvements in and for said Parish of Iberia, pursuant to an ordinance of the Police Jury of said Parish, duly passed and adopted, and by virtue of said ordinance in strict conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana, as amended in the year 1912. The principal and interest of said bonds are payable out of a sufficient part of the ten mills on the dollar valuation, over and above what has been appropriated to pay the statutory and ordinary charges of said Parish.

It is hereby certified and recited, that all the conditions and things required by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana to exist, happen and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, exist, have happened and been performed in regular and due form, time and manner as required by law; that the amount of this bond together with all indebtedness of said Parish does not exceed any limitations prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of said State. For the enforcement of the covenants, recitals and stipulations herein contained and for the levy and collection of a sufficient tax to provide for the prompt payment of this bond and the interest thereon, the full faith, credit and resources of said Parish are hereby irrevocably pledged.

Be It Further Ordained, that the President and the Secretary of the Police Jury of the Parish of Iberia, Louisiana, are hereby authorized and directed to execute said bonds and interest coupons for and on behalf of such Parish, substantially in the manner and form aforesaid provided, however, that the interest coupons may be executed with their lithographed signatures. After being executed as aforesaid, said bonds shall be delivered to J. R. Sutherland and Company, Kansas City, Missouri, or to such person or persons as they may direct, upon payment of the purchased price thereof. Proceeds of such bonds shall be used and applied solely for the purposes herein designated. It is, however, understood, that the purchaser of said bonds shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money.

Be It Further Ordained, that in order to make provisions for the prompt payment of the installments of interest and principal of said bonds, the Parish of Iberia, does hereby solemnly covenant and agree to levy each year so long as any of said bonds or coupons are outstanding and unpaid, the full authorized limit of ten mills on the dollar valuation upon all of the taxable property within said Parish of Iberia, and cause to be done whatever may be necessary to promptly and fully collect same; and it is further covenanted and agreed that there shall be and there is hereby appropriated out of the ten mills tax authorized to be levied by virtue of Article 232 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana a tax, as follows, in excess of the tax that has been appropriated for all statutory and ordinary charges of the Parish, and the avails of the following tax shall be set aside and applied solely for the payment of the interest accruing on said bonds and the principal of said bonds as they fall due.

Mr. Jacob moved that the above offer of J. R. Sutherland & Co. for the purchase of the bonds be accepted, this was seconded by Dr. Boykin and carried by the following Yea and Nay vote.
Yeas—Dr. Sanders, Dr. Boykin, Messrs. Decurt, Delcambre, Gary, Gates, Jacob, Landry, Romero and Walet. Nays, none.
Absent, Mr. Drullhet

Mr. Jacob submitted the following ordinance which was on his motion, seconded by Mr. Romero, unanimously adopted.
Whereas, the sale of \$40,000.00 of Parish Bonds will permit the expenditure of \$8,000.00 for road and bridge work during the year 1916, and
Whereas, it is imperative and necessary that the \$8,000.00 above provided for road and bridge work be judiciously and economically expended in order to secure the best results for the Parish, now therefore,

Be It Resolved and Ordained, by the Police Jury of Iberia Parish, in regular session assembled, that the Secretary be and that he is hereby instructed and directed to set apart \$2,000.00 of the above mentioned \$8,000.00 for the upkeep of the Parish mules, Road Implements and Ditching Machine; and that he apportion the remaining \$6,000.00 among the several wards, in proportion to the assessment of said wards; and that he credit to each ward monthly with one-twelfth (1-12) of the total annual apportionment due to such ward.
Be It Further Resolved and Ordained, that the Finance Committee is hereby instructed and directed to improve the issuance of vouchers for road and bridge work for each ward, for an amount not to exceed the credit due any one ward at the time that bills may be presented for approval.

It was moved by Mr. Jacob, seconded by Dr. Boykin and carried, that the Secretary be instructed to publish a notice in the Official Journal requesting that all outstanding bills be filed with the Secretary, not later than February 1st; and further, that published notice be given in the official journal, that hereafter, all orders for supplies for the Parish must bear the endorsement of a member of the purchasing committee, and invoices be furnished the Secretary immediately for all goods sold to the Parish.

Dr. H. A. King and Messrs. A. C. Bernard and E. L. Estorge asked that the Jury continue the monthly appropriation of \$40.00 to the Chamber of Commerce. On motion of Mr. Jacob, seconded by Mr. Gates and carried, this request was granted and the Secretary instructed to issue vouchers for the amount appropriated.

Mr. Jacob moved that Mr. John Deslatte be employed to drag the Avere Road whenever necessary, at a compensation of \$3.50 per day for the services of one man and a team of four

mules, to be charged to the account of the Seventh Ward. This was seconded by Mr. Gates and carried.
It was moved by Mr. Walet, seconded by Mr. Jacob and carried, that the Secretary be instructed to notify Messrs. F. M. Bodin and Lastie Bertrand to resume the dragging of the Lorcainville Road when necessary.
Messrs. Desire Delcambre and Arthur LeBlanc, asked that a bridge be constructed by the Jury over the canal across the Public Road opposite the property of Burke and Davis, in the Fifth Ward, recently dug by the Petit Anse-Coleau Drainage Board, explaining that the canal was dug at the request of adjacent property holders for the sole purpose of draining the public road of that locality.
On motion of Mr. Gates, seconded by Mr. Jacob and carried, a bridge was ordered built over the canal in question, Mr. Romero voting against the motion.
Mr. Decurt moved that the Chamber Lumber Co. be given a voucher for \$100.00 representing one-half the cost of a bridge over the canal recently dug by the Iberia St. Mary Canal Drainage District No. 2 and that the amount be charged to the account in the first and second wards. This was duly accounted and carried.
The committee appointed at the last meeting to make repairs to be made to the approach to the Petit Anse Bridge reported that they had negotiated with Mr. Herpiche for the work necessary. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the action of the committee was approved.
On the request of the Chamber Lumber Co. for an appropriation of \$100.00 to help defray the expenses of the attorney concerning a reduction of freight rates on sand and gravel, was tabled.
On motion of Mr. Gary, seconded by Mr. Delcambre and carried, the members of the Sixth Ward were authorized to use prisoners for road repairs within the ward, provided that not less than six prisoners be employed at such labor; and that the Deputy Sheriff in charge should not be compensated at a greater rate than \$1.50 per day.
Mr. Gary moved that all of the principal roads of the Parish be dragged whenever deemed necessary by the Jurors of the several wards, provided that the cost does not exceed \$15.00 per month for each member of the Jury. This was seconded by Mr. Landry and carried.
It was moved by Mr. Walet, seconded by Mr. Jacob and carried, that Assessor T. A. Derouen be instructed to make a supplemental roll of property listed by Engineer Walter V. Kemper as having been omitted from the roll of 1915; and that he notify the owners of all supplemental property of the taxes due on such.

On motion of Dr. Boykin, seconded by Mr. Jacob and carried, the bill of O. Remouet for supplies from March 1915 to January 1916 was referred to the purchasing committee and to Secretary and road foreman to be checked and adjusted.
