THE GOOD ROADS INVESTIGATION.

On Thursday evening last, as per invitation of Dr. W. F. Carstens fully thirty automobiles loaded with some of our enthusiastic citizens left from in front of the Estorce Drug Store on a tour of inspection of some of the recently completed model dirt roads in the Southern part of the Parish. PROCEEDINGS OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

A called meeting of the Iberia Parish Board of School Directors was held on the above named date with the following members present: President Verret, Dr. Perret, Messrs. Winters, Landry, Hall and Minvielle, constituting a quorum of the said Board.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, and on motion of Mr. Landry, seconded by Mr. Winters, and carried, same were approved.

Mr. A. B. Romero appeared before the Board and outlined to the members the platform on which he is running for the office of Sheriff of Iberia Parish. Mr. Romero called the attention of the Board to that part of his platform wherein he pledged himself, in the event of his election, to divide the fees and emoluments of the office of Sheriff into three equal parts: one-third to be turned over to the public schools of the Parish, one-third to be turned over to the road fund of the Parish, and the remaining one-third to be retained by him as his sole compensation.

The Board viewed Mr. Romero's proposition as patriotic and public-spirited.

A discussion of the Board's claims on the Village of Delcambre, Mr. Dallas and Mr. F. J. Mestayer, respectively, resulted in the motion by Mr. Hall, seconded by Mr. Landry, and carried, that the Secretary instruct the District Attorney to proceed within the next thirty days with the suits which he has been instructed to file for this Board.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned.

BOY SCOUTS IN IBERIA.

"The rapid growth of the Boy Scouts in America is shown by the statement made at the annual meeting of the national council held in Washington. During the last year the membership has increased 46 per cent. There are now 182,622 boys and scoutmasters in the United States. According to the chief scout executive's report, there are scout organizations in nearly every church denomination in the country, and 3489 troops meet regularly in churches, while 3886 meet in school buildings, gymnasiums, and community institutions. Among the 7067 scoutmasters there are clergymen, physicians, lawyers, teachers and representatives of other professions, all men of exceptionally high character and devoted to the movement."

In New Iberia we have an organization of Boy Scouts that was organized some months ago by Rev. Lutz who has been called to other fields in the performance of his ministerial duties. Since his departure, Dr. J. W. K. Shaw has kindly volunteered to fill the position of Scout Master to the delight of the young men who belong to the Boy Scout movement and on Friday night of each week they hold their regular meetings in the large building, corner of Main and French streets. STAMPEDED EUROPE.

Holloway, La., Dec. 30.
 In the year 1881 Henry George said:
 "Private property in land blocks the way of advancing civilization. The two cannot long co-exist. Either private property in land must be abolished, or, as has happened again and again in the history of mankind, civilization must again turn back in anarchy and bloodshed. Even now I believe the inevitable struggle has begun. It is not conservatism which would ignore such a tremendous fact. It is the blindness which would invite destruction. He that is truly conservative, let him look the facts in the face, let him speak frankly and dispassionately. This is the duty of the hour. For, when a great social question presses for settlement, it is only for a little while that the voice of reason can be heard. The masses of men hardly think at any time. It is difficult, even in sober moments to get them to reason calmly. But when passion is roused, then they are like a herd of stampeded bulls. I do not fear that present social adjustments can continue. That is impossible. What I fear is that the dams may hold till the flood rises to fury."

This it has done in Europe today. The blindest can not dispute this fact. Shall we continue the stand-pat-ism that has invited and brought on the destruction there? Is not the cause and fury of the conflagration to be found in the injustice which permits a few men like the Riabouchinski brothers to own and monopolize six million acres of land near so great and populous a center as Moscow?

Such a policy, combined with war preparedness, has destroyed most of the great and wealthy nations of the past. Such a policy has lighted and kept burning the fuse of war in Europe. Such a policy has made the Riabouchinski brothers possible. Now they, like other wealthy land monopolists of Europe, have not only money, but men to burn. Destroy the flower of the country, the strongest, the bravest and the best, and the task of holding God's world forever the same will be an easy matter. Then, when the Christ with bowed head, passes that way, they will answer him:
