TWELVE LINERS NEAR ZONE.

New York, March 2.—The scheduled opening of the new submarine campaign of the Teutonic powers which was set for today finds twelve big liners in or near the war zone in which Austrian and German undersea boats are operating.

The liners are: Crete, White Star line; Italian line; Torina, Italian line; Lafayette, French line; Philadelphia, American line; Finland, in American line service; Bergenfjord, Norwegian American line; America, Italian line; Patria, Fabre line; Pannonia, Cunard line, and the Jeannina and Vasilefs Constantios, of the Greek line.

None of these vessels is believed to be armed unless they have mounted guns since sailing.

The Italian steamship America, one of the ships which have had guns placed on board by the Italian government, is today believed to be in the war zone with 182 cabin and 1732 steerage passengers bound for New York.

The America, according to cable advices, received by local agents here today, sailed from Naples, February 23.

He would make these officials responsible to him as governor and relieve them in his way of all responsibility to the public whom they are supposed to serve.

He would turn back the pages of political history in Louisiana a quarter of a century, give the governor all the power required to establish a political dynasty and undo all the reforms for which the people have struggled these many years. This done, he would turn Louisiana over to Theodore Roosevelt as conquered province.—Shreveport Times.

STEAMER THORNABY SINKS.

British Boat First Vessel to Perish in New U-Boat Campaign.

London, March 1.—The British steamship Thornaby is reported to have been sunk, nearly all the members of the crew having been killed or drowned.

The Thornaby was owned in West Hartlepool, England. Her gross tonnage was 1782. She was built in 1889 and was 258 feet long.

The Thornaby sailed on January 19 from Sunderland, England, for Palermo, Sicily.

The steamer Devexoux has arrived in the Tyne, bringing Steward Cartberg, who was rescued from the wreckage of the Thornaby. The captain of the Devexoux reports that two other persons from the Thornaby were saved by the steamer Highgate and that a Norwegian vessel was also in the vicinity where the Thornaby went down.

Although the British censorship prevents a transmission of details concerning the reported sinking of the Thornaby, the reference to the members of the crew having probably been killed or drowned, indicates she was sunk by a mine or a torpedo.

The German and Austrian decrees regarding the sinking of armed merchantmen without warning went into effect at midnight. The Thornaby is the first vessel whose sinking has been reported since the orders became operative, but the London dispatch does not indicate whether she was armed or whether she was sunk before or after the beginning of the month.

FROM FARM TO KITCHEN.

Express companies are becoming interested in an extension of the farmer's market, especially in early fruits and vegetables, dairy products, poultry and other farm products, so that they can be carried direct from the farmer's gate to the city consumer's kitchen door.

When the plans which are projected by certain express companies are fully matured it will mean the addition of millions of dollars to the income of the southern farmer. It would mean that much that goes to waste now would be turned into money.

To bring about this most desirable result, it is important that the farmers in every community should get in touch with the agents the difficulties to the proposed exchange of products direct to the consumer, that can be removed by a thorough understanding between the farmer and the express company.

The Southern Express Co., now issues a pamphlet designed to aid in the marketing of the products produced on the southern farm. The agents are told that they cannot aid better in developing the trade as through placing the consumers, or dealers, in direct communication with producers. This company publishes a list of dealers, shippers and growers of oranges, lemons, limes, pineapples, etc., in its territory.

If other express companies will follow this lead, and will go a step farther, and to city consumers name the cost of different products, express prepaid, the last obstacle to the exchange will disappear, and householders will be able to supply themselves through direct orders to the express companies.—Southern Vindicator.
