But when he begins by saying that our industries are on the verge of dissolution at the hands of our untrustworthy public officers, that our finance is only another name for bankruptcy, and that the new standard for morals at Washington will be organized by his Party—and when practically all of the leaders of that Party have split and are at present dividing that much needed oil of salvation between the Republicans and the Democrats, and when my distinguished opponent claims as his own the views of these two great parties and finally winding up by asking the support and sympathy of a third party in an effort to make good people of this District the scape goat of the whole business, the obvious conclusion is that he thinks we are either political lunatics, or charlatans, or both.
