MIXED MORE INCONSISTENCIES.

The taxpayers of this community expected an economical administration from the Police Jury, now in office. In this, they are verily mistaken, for economy is evidently an unknown term to them, if we cite the many instances when large sums could have been saved.

First: The Parish printing was given to the highest bidder, at a great loss to this Parish.

Second: A contract was made with the Sheriff, contrary to law, sacrificing hundreds of dollars unnecessarily.

Third: A reduction of five hundred dollars, throughout the Parish, on the liquor license was granted; when the City license is fixed at one thousand dollars; an unjust discrimination, to say the least. Due credit, however, should be given the members of the Jury who voted against this reduction; but, what is to be said when these very same men, at the next session of the Jury swelled a unanimous vote for an increase in the Secretary-Treasurer salary to one hundred dollars per month.

The taxpayers have to shoulder all this unjust distribution of their hard won earnings and still, not one word of protest is uttered against such proceedings.

Can we ever look forward to any advancement under such conditions? I say, no! For prosperity will only mean a greater demand for increases in salary by our public officials and other drains that will necessitate increased taxation.

The taxpayers are very docile, however, and should be complimented for their humble submission to all burdens thrust upon them.
