MISSION DAY AT PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

In the little "church around the corner" which is growing so fast and strong, that the walls must either be pushed out, or an extension built. The Ladies Aid have an especial work assigned for every meeting. Last Tuesday was Mission Day, and many excellent papers were read, but unfortunately we were just too late to hear them. The one following however, was so full of interesting information and valuable statistics that we asked the privilege of letting one of our excellent newspapers spread the news around; Mrs. W. G. Weeks very modestly agreed. So here it is:

"Our church this year is making special efforts toward extending the work of the Mountain Missions and as Presbyterian workers throughout the states are answering to the strong appeals made, we feel we must give this Soul Winners Society or American Inland Mission, as it was originally called some of our attention. And here let me add that since the death of its founder, the name has been changed to the Guerrant Inland Mission.

Dr. Edward O. Guerrant, the founder of this Society was the Pastor of the aristocratic First Presbyterian church of Louisville, Ky., but feeling the call to the Mission fields when he was appointed Synodical Missionary, he accepted at once. He began his work among these mountaineers of Kentucky, Virginia, West Virginia and Tennessee, organized

church after church, sent missionary into these hills when the Synod met and ordered him not to build so many churches and schools as they could not afford to pay for them. Then a wonderful thing happened—wonderful because it was so simple in a man of great faith. He resigned and before the Synod, uttered these words: "Brethren, if you cannot afford to pay for the schools and churches and the missionaries for the poor Highlanders, God can pay for them". And he went back home in Wilmore, Ky. There he knelt and asked God for help. The money commenced to pour in, church after church has been established, school after school has been built, missionaries after missionaries have been gathered for these fields. The orphan children were gathered into a home, cared for and educated.

In 1911, Dr. Guerrant, who, up to that time, had sole responsibility for this work, turned over to the Presbyterian church all his work including fifty missionaries and property consisting of churches, schools and orphanages, valued at \$50,000.

In ten years 362 missionaries employed by this society held over 22,000 public meetings at 10,069 places resulting in 6,304 conversions. They taught 879 Bible schools with 39,456 pupils, built 56 churches, school and mission houses, including three academies and an orphan asylum, among them being Beechund Seminary at Heidelberg, Ky., Highland School at Guerrant, Ky., Canyon Falls Academy and Stuart Robinson School at Blackey, Ky.

Though wonders have been accomplished by this man of prayer yet only the outer edge of the harvest has been gathered. There is much to be done and much to be given to this work. One missionary writes, "The time seems ripe and the people ready to receive the Gospel and truly the harvest is great and the reapers few.

A missionary when asked what were the great trials they had to bear, answered, First, separation from our loved ones, which is a great sacrifice; second, lack of funds when there is so much to be done; and third, the indifference of the people back home. They will not pray for us. Where is the money, where the needed workers and where are those who will assist us with their prayers. The mountaineers need you and me, our money and our prayers and those of all christianity. The world shall never be won for Christ until the Gospel shall be preached unto all people."

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

The Board of Trustees of the City of New Iberia convened this day in regular session with Mayor Sealy presiding, Messrs. Suberbielle and Villerman present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on motion of Mr. Suberbielle, seconded by Mr. Villerman.

The Board of Trustees invite all those property owners within the City limits, possessing lots that are vacant, to submit a list of such idle property, so that the cultivation along lines as recommended by the United States government, may be started as early as possible, the Mayor of the City is authorized to have published a sufficient number of posters to have distributed to the public informing them of this recommendation.

The following resolution was received and ordered spread on the minutes on motion of Mr. Sealy, seconded by Mr. Villerman, and adopted unanimously.

New Iberia, La., Apr. 12, 17. Whereas the peace and tranquility of these United States of America have been jeopardized by the flagrant wrongs of the Imperial German Government,

And whereas, we realize that we are citizens of these United States of America and we feel that we should express our loyalty in upholding the dignity of our country and flag,

Be it Resolved that, we the colored citizens of New Iberia, Louisiana in Mass Meeting, assembled do pledge our undying loyalty to our President, Country and Flag.

Be it further Resolved that, we tender our services to the President in any manner that he may see fit in this pending crisis.

Be it further Resolved that a copy of these resolutions be sent to the President of these United States of America, our Senator, Governor and the Mayor of our City.

CUBAN PREPAREDNESS.
