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**GRAND JURY REPORT.**

To the Honorable Judge of the  
19th Judicial District Court in  
and for the Parish of Iberia,  
Louisiana:

We, your Grand Jurors, em-  
paneled and sworn to inquire in  
and for the Parish of Iberia, beg  
leave to make this our final re-  
port:

We have examined a number  
of cases submitted to us and have  
reported to your Court twenty-  
three true bills and eighteen no  
true bills.

We find that the laws through-  
out the Parish of Iberia are be-  
ing enforced.

We have examined the jail and  
Court House, and find that the jail  
should be repainted inside and  
the plumbing therein put in good,  
sanitary condition; that the wir-  
ing for lighting purposes should  
be renewed and that the step at  
the entrance to the jail is worn  
out and should be replaced with  
good, substantial masonry. With  
these exceptions, we find the jail  
to be in as clean and sanitary  
condition as a public building  
may be kept under the present  
conditions.

We have examined the Court-  
house and regret to say that we  
find this in a dilapidated condi-  
tion; the plastering is falling  
from the walls, and during the  
week after a shower the Court  
room was wet from a leaky roof.  
The furniture in the Court room  
is not sufficient nor appropriate  
for the needs of the officers of  
the Court and the members of  
the Bar, nor for those persons  
who are called on business to the  
Court room. Owing to these de-  
lapidated conditions, the Grand  
Jury would suggest and recom-  
mend that a new site be secured  
and a new Courthouse erected  
thereon, and this dilapidated  
Court house now in use be dis-  
posed of.

The Grand Jury finds that the  
location of the present Court-  
house is not a suitable one, for  
the reason that it is in the center  
of the business district of the  
City where the street cars, auto-  
mobiles and all other conveyan-  
ces pass and cause considerable  
noise and annoys the hearings in  
the Court room.

We find that the public roads  
in this Parish are in as good  
condition as they should be, and  
we also find a few bad bridges  
along the public roads. Realizing  
the financial condition of the Parish,  
we would suggest that the public  
roads with the limited means at  
the hands of the Police Jury  
should be repaired at once and  
proper bridges placed where nec-  
essary.

We find that all of the officers  
of the Parish are doing their  
duty, and that the violations of  
the law in the Parish of Iberia  
are on the wane; that only one  
serious case was brought to the  
Grand Jury and in this case an  
indictment has been returned.

We take this opportunity of  
thanking the Deputy Sheriff in  
charge of the Grand Jury for his  
valuable services and his many  
courtesies extended to the Grand  
Jury while in session.

We also thank the District At-  
torney for his valuable services  
rendered the Grand Jury.


**FLAG DAY PRESBYTERIAN

stood;


He has loosed the fateful lightening
