Some of us who stay at home almost wish we were to be soldiers, as we read of the novelty and interest the men are finding in the new army cantonment life. It must appeal particularly to many types of men who hitherto have led very quiet and isolated lives.

There will be hosts of farmer boys who previously scarcely saw any greater assemblage of men than you would gather at the cross roads post office or church. At home they communed mostly with their own thoughts. They went in but little for social life, as they could reach the country gatherings only by long walks in the evening. This isolation develops a rugged but too independent type of character. The enthusiasm of a regiment of men will be a thrilling experience to such.

Also it will do these fellows good to realize that the city boys are not all gudes and weaklings. They will find many of them very athletic, and quite able to throw the country boys at a "wrestling" match. Also it will do the city boys good to see that the country boy is not necessarily a hayseed. He may be shy of manner, but underneath there is a keen observation and shrewd comment on what he sees.

Men who previously never left the boundaries of their native states will be swapping experiences with those from the cities they only knew dimly as a memory of geography study. It will do them good to realize that their own locality does not possess all advantages nor all wisdom.

Travel is supposed to be beneficial, but the great majority of people never get much of it. The army boys will now see the world, but even better than that, they will get what is the major advantage of seeing the world, the meeting with people from widely diverse occupations and localities. Men of sluggish ambition will be roused when they find out what others are doing, and their eyes will be open to many opportunities. This army service will be a tremendous experience in a great many ways other than the military and fighting side of it.—Ruston-Leader.



**A SCATHING DENUNCIATION.**

Every patriotic American and every German citizen, Pro-German and weak-kneed American should study well and earnestly the terrible arraignment of the irresponsible German government, contained in President Wilson's reply to the Pope. It is a master stroke and leaves no doubt as to what the President thinks of the Kaiser and his brutal advisers.

President Wilson says: "It is manifest that no part of this program can be successfully carried out unless the restitution of the status quo ante furnishes a firm and satisfactory basis for it. The object of this war is to deliver the free peoples of the actual power of a vast military establishment controlled by an irresponsible government, which, having secretly planned to dominate the world proceeded to carry the plan out without regard either to the sacred obligations of treaty or the long established practices and long cherished principles of international action and honor; which chose its own time for the war; delivered its blows fiercely and suddenly, stopped at no barrier either of law or of mercy; swept a whole continent with the tide of blood—not the blood of soldiers only, but the blood of innocent women and children also, and of the helpless poor; and now stands balked but not defeated, the enemy of four-fifths of the world. The power is, not the German people. It is the ruthless master of the German people. It is no business of ours how that great people came under its control or submitted with temporary zest to the domination of its purpose; but it is our business to see to it that the history of the rest of the world is no longer left to its handling.

"We cannot take the word of the present rulers of Germany as a guarantee of anything that is to endure, unless explicitly supported by such conclusive evi-

dence of the will and purpose of the German people themselves as the other people of the world would be justified in accepting. Without such guarantee, treaties of settlements, agreements for disarmament, covenants to set up arbitration in place of force, territorial adjustments, re-establishments of small states if made with the German government, no man, no nation could now depend on. We must await some new evidence of the purposes of the great peoples of the central powers. God grant it may be given soon and in a way to restore the confidence of all peoples everywhere in the faith of nations and the possibility of a remnant of peace."—Ex.

**SOLDIER FOOD BILL OF U. S. \$800,000 DAY.**

Philadelphia, Sept. 19.—"War has made Uncle Sam the biggest buyer of food in this country and the board bill for his soldiers will be \$800,000 a day," Charles Lathrop Paek, president of the National Emergency Food Garden Commission, of Washington, today told the food conference of the American Academy of Political and Social Science.

"We are to have two million men under arms shortly according to the best reports. At 40 cents a day it will be seen what that means.

"I am told that the reserve stock of foodstuffs at each camp is \$125,000, and there are 33 camps in the country today. That means that food valued at \$4,125,000 is taken out of the regular channels of trade.

"We have had one year's experience and have raised \$350,000,000 worth of produce in our war gardens. Next year we will do even better. We will then have more war gardens and the average product of each will be larger. Housewives of this country this year have preserved and canned at least 460,000,000 jars of vegetables and fruits."
