Proceedings of Police Jury.

The Police Jury of the Parish of Iberia met this 27th day of February 1919, in special session at New Iberia, La., as the governing authority of Road District No. 4 of the Parish of Iberia, La., pursuant to the terms of the ordinance of the Police Jury, passed at its meeting of January 23rd, 1919 and pursuant to the following notice sent by mail to each member of the Police Jury:

New Iberia, La., Feb. 24, '19.
To Messrs. E. J. Gary, H. Romero, Louis Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, A. A. Theriot, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath, Numa Miguez, Dr. A. C. McGowen and A. P. Moresi.

Gentlemen—Your presence is requested at a special meeting of the Police Jury on Thursday, Feb. 27th, 1919 at 11 A. M., acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 4 of the Parish of Iberia, and of Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia and Road District No. 7 of the Parish of Iberia, La., to receive and pass on the bids for the purchase of the Bonds of Road District No. 4, and of Road District No. 6 and Road District No. 7 and to transact such other business relating to said Road Districts as may come before the meeting.

Present: Messrs. E. J. Gary, Louis Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath, Numa Miguez. Absent: H. Romero, A. A. Theriot, Dr. A. C. McGowen and A. P. Moresi.

The Vice President Mr. Dietlein, acting in the absence of Mr. A. A. Theriot, called the meeting to order, with the Secretary at his desk.

The Secretary read the advertisement from the New Iberia Enterprise, authorized by an ordinance passed at the meeting of the Police Jury as the governing authority of Road District No. 4 of the Parish of Iberia on Jan. 23d, 1919 calling for bids for the purchase of the Bonds of Road District No. 4 of the Parish of Iberia, La., aggregating Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) and stated that he had received and had in his possession six (6) sealed bids for said bonds.

Moved by Mr. Miguez, seconded by Mr. Gonsoulin, that this governing authority of Road District No. 4 open these bids in open session and consider and pass on same, this motion being put to a vote the result was:

Yeas: Messrs. E. J. Gary, J. Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath, Numa Miguez. Nays, None.

And the motion was declared carried. Thereupon in open session it being past the hour of 11 A. M. the hour set for the opening of the bids the following bids were opened and read, viz:

By W. S. Bonner of New Orleans, La., offering par value and \$350.00 bonus, with condition attached to the bid.

Mr. W. L. Slayton, Toledo, Ohio, offering par value and \$200.00 bonus with condition attached to the bid.

Porteus R. Burke, Attorney of New Iberia, La., offering par value and \$380.00 bonus, unconditional.

The bids of Messrs. Jerry Briggs and company, offering par value for the whole issue of \$170,000, with a premium of \$401.50 less a commission of \$20,750.00.

The bid of Sidney Spitzer & Co. of Montgomery, Ala. offering \$142,800 and accrued interests for the whole issue of Road District No. 4, 6 and 7 amounting to \$479,000.00.

The bid of Graves, Blanchet & Thornburgh of Toledo, Ohio, offering par value for the whole issue of Road District No. 4, 6 and 7 and accrued interests, but with condition.

After reading of the foregoing bids it was decided to go into executive session and consider same.

After consideration in executive session of all the bids, the bid of Mr. Porteus Burke, Attorney, being deemed the most acceptable one and the one complying more fully with the law, was moved by Mr. Miguez, seconded by Mr. Derouen and carried that all the

bids be rejected and they are hereby rejected at the exception of the bid submitted by Mr. Porteus R. Burke.

At this juncture, Mr. Pierce, in behalf of Mr. W. S. Bonner, who had submitted a bid, stated that he desired to protest against the bid made by Porteus R. Burke, attorney on the ground that Mr. Burke did not name specifically the Bank which he proposed to designate as the Fiscal Agency of the District in the event of his bid being accepted.

In view of these facts it was moved by Mr. Decuir, seconded by Mr. Gary and carried that Mr. Burke be called to discuss with this Body the matter of the protest of Mr. Pierce.

Whereupon Mr. Burke appeared and stated that he had not as yet determined which Bank in the State of Louisiana or the City of New Iberia that he would designate as the fiscal agent in the event that the Bonds being awarded to him under his bid, but that he was willing and ready to designate only such Bank in the State of Louisiana as might be mutually satisfactory.

Whereupon it was moved by Mr. Erath, seconded by Mr. Miguez and carried that the Police Jury of the Parish of Iberia, acting as governing authority of Road District No. 4 adjourn until March 6th, 1919 and that the bid of Mr. Burke be kept in suspense in order to obtain legal advice.

The Police Jury then reconvened and organized as the governing authority of Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia, La. Present, Messrs. E. J. Gary, Louis Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath, Numa Miguez; Absent, Messrs. H. Romero, A. A. Theriot, Dr. A. C. McGowen, A. P. Moresi.

The Vice President called the Police Jury to order as the governing authority of Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia, La. the Secretary at his desk, the meeting being called pursuant to the terms of the ordinance of the Police Jury passed on Jan. 27th, 1919 and notice of said meeting having been given to each member in accord with the notice shown at the beginning of these proceedings.

The Secretary read the advertisement in the New Iberia Enterprise, said advertisement being in the form as authorized by the ordinance of the Police Jury as the governing authority of Road District No. 6 on Jan. 23d, 1919, calling for bids for the purchase of the Bonds of Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia, La., aggregating Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) and stated that he had received and had in his possession three sealed bids for the purchase of said bonds.

Moved by Mr. Erath, seconded by Mr. Gary that this governing authority of Road District No. 6 open these bids in open session and consider and pass on same, this motion being put to a vote the result was: Yeas: Messrs. E. J. Gary, L. Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath and Numa Miguez. Nays, None.

And the motion was declared carried. Thereupon in open session

By Mr. L. Slayton & Co. of Toledo, Ohio, offering par value and \$400.00 bonus, with condition attached to their bid.

By Mr. Porteus Burke, Attorney, offering par value and \$380.00 bonus, without any conditions.

After reading of the above bids it was decided to go into executive session again and consider same.

After consideration in executive session of all the bids the bid of Mr. Porteus Burke, Attorney, being deemed the most acceptable and the one complying more fully with the law, it was moved by Mr. Erath, seconded by Mr. Decuir and carried that all the bids be rejected at the exception of the bid from Mr. Burke.

The same protest made by Mr. Pierce for the bid of Mr. Burke for the purchase of the bonds for Road District No. 4, was reiterated in connection with this bid and whereupon it was moved by Mr. Erath, seconded by Mr. Miguez and carried that Mr. Burke be again called to discuss the matter of the protest of Mr. Pierce.

Mr. Burke appeared and stated that the proposition made by him as a result of the protest made by Mr. Pierce in connection with the purchase of the bonds of Road District No. 4 is the same as applying to the Bonds of Road District No. 6 and that he was ready to designate only such bank in the State of Louisiana as may be mutually satisfactory.

Whereupon it was moved by Mr. Gonsoulin, seconded by Mr. Gary that the Police Jury as the governing authority of Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia adjourn until Thursday, Mar. 6th, 1919 and that the bid of Mr. Burke be kept in suspense until legal advice could be obtained, but before adjourning it was moved by Mr. Erath, seconded by Mr. Miguez that a Board of Supervisors for Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia is hereby appointed to consist of Messrs. J. W. Wyche, J. C. Curtis, Fred Leitmeyer, Clet Dumesnil and Jean Courrege, all property tax payers residing in Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia, La.

The vote of this motion resulted as follows: Yeas: Messrs. E. J. Gary, Louis Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath, Numa Miguez. Nays, none, and the motion is hereby declared carried.

Whereupon the Police Jury of the Parish of Iberia, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 6 of the Parish of Iberia, adjourned until Thursday, March 6th, 1919 as stated above, keeping the bid of Mr. Burke in suspense until said date, in order to obtain legal advice.

The Police Jury of the Parish of Iberia convened and organized as the governing authority of Road District No. 7 of the Parish of Iberia, La., in pursuance of the terms of the ordinance of the Police Jury of date Jan. 23d, 1919, and pursuant to the notice given each member of the Police Jury in the form shown at the beginning of these proceedings.

Present: Messrs. E. J. Gary, Louis Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath, Numa Miguez. Absent: Messrs. H. Romero, A. A. Theriot, Dr. A. C. McGowen and A. P. Moresi.

The Vice President called the Police Jury to order as the governing authority of Road District No. 7 of the Parish of Iberia, the Secretary at his desk.

The Secretary then read the advertisement in the New Iberia Enterprise, as authorized at the meeting of the Police Jury on Jan. 23d, 1919 as the governing authority of Road District No. 7 of the Parish of Iberia, La., calling for the bids for the purchase of the bonds of Road District No. 7 of the Parish of Iberia aggregating Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00). It being past the hour of 11 A. M. the Vice President asked the Secretary if any bids had been received. The Secretary stated that he had received and had in his possession three sealed bids for the purchase of said bonds.

Moved by Mr. Miguez, seconded by Mr. Erath that this Police Jury as the governing authority of Road District No. 7 of the Parish of Iberia, open these bids in open session and consider and pass on same.

The motion being put to a vote, the result was: Yeas: Messrs. E. J. Gary, Louis Decuir, A. Gonsoulin, H. Derouen, F. Dietlein, V. J. Erath and Numa Miguez; Nays, none.

And the motion was declared carried.

After consideration in executive session of all the bids, the bid of Mr. Burke, attorney, being deemed the most acceptable of all the bids and the one complying more fully with the law, it was moved by Mr. Miguez, seconded by Mr. Derouen and carried that all the bids be rejected and they are hereby rejected with the exception of the bid submitted by Mr. Burke, attorney.
