**LEGISLATING THE CATTLE TICK.**

While opposition to the League of Nations continues strong within Congress and along the highways in the fear that certain inalienable rights may be snatched away from us while we sleep, the actual rate of speed by which the laws of lawmaking bodies are enacted is shown, if the cattle tick may be used as a figurative speedometer, in a recent speech in Congress by Representative Howard, of Oklahoma:

"A certain Southern State was attempting to remove ticks from the cattle. The State had 60 men traveling under salaries of \$100 a month each and an expense account, and we found that the National Government had 70 men traveling over the same State with like expense accounts doing the same thing. These two branches of the Government had different ideas as to the size of the vafs. They had different ideas as to the kind of solution in which the cow was to be dipped, with the result that when they got together and started to work the cow had died of old age and the ravages of the tick."—The Nation's Business for October.

ing used than is manufactured; that high prices are inevitable, and that paper stocks are already at the danger line.

Mr. Carvalho bases the increased price of paper on the four following things:

- "First—The labor cost per ton on white paper is now \$20 against \$10 four years ago.
- "Second—It takes one ton of coal to make one ton of paper and coal at the mill has practically doubled in price.
- "Third—The haul on pulp wood is growing greater each year; likewise the freight charges.
- "Fourth—The six to nine cent markets of Europe, South America and Australia are now asking for Canada and United States paper."

Before the war the price of paper was given little consideration by publishers in figuring publication costs. Today it is a very important item. The only way to meet the advance is for publishers to secure better advertising and subscription rates, the only sources of revenue.

The Philadelphia Record says: "Something like 40,000 dozen extra stale eggs are in storage in New York. An idea. Why not a parade of the reactionary members of the United States Senate along Fifth avenue?" This may be answered by another question: Why waste the eggs on something even more rotten than they are?

The employees of Illinois Central and the Texas & Pacific railroads in New Orleans have organized a co-operative plan for the purchase of groceries and other food stuff. The object is to buy from wholesalers and to sell direct to members of the association so as to reduce the high prices.

**AMERICAN RED CROSS NOTES.**

The work of the Iberia Parish Chapter, American Red Cross, is steadily going on in the various departments. Work has been accomplished in various branches, in Home Service Department, the First Aid and other departments, throughout the summer months. Much interest has been displayed by all members, much good work has been done. There is a great deal more to be accomplished, in the After Care work, in furnishing information and service to the soldier and sailor, and interest on the part of all members should not grow less in the cause of Red Cross activities, as this is a serious period of the Armistice and a great deal of work is yet to be accomplished.

**Sewing and Knitting Departments.**  
On October 1st, a small allotment of sewing and knitting will be expected to be made by Iberia Parish Chapter, American Red Cross, as follows: Garments, sweaters and shawls, 30; these for children principally. New Iberia branch will take 100 garments and 20 sweaters or shawls. Jeanerette branch one-third of this quota, or 50 garments and 10 sweaters or shawls. The same heads of sewing and knitting departments as during the May and June period. For New Iberia and Jeanerette, Mrs. Braey, being the newly appointed Supervisor of knitting for Jeanerette. All the other officers stand as appointed during the spring season through-out the Parish Chapter with Mrs. C. C. Edwards, Chairman of Chapter Production to inspect and supervise this work. Above allotment will arrive about October 1st, and must be in Division warehouse in New Orleans not later than December 1st, but made and reported at Iberia Parish Chapter headquarters, 121 Jefferson Street, not later than November the 15th, 1919, as delays must not occur. Each member is expected to be ready in a few days to take a small share of this work. New members will be appreciated, and garments must be made according to regulations. The ladies of the Chapter are much appreciated by Division headquarters for their high sense of duty.
