EDUCATIONAL TRIP PROPOSED FOR BOYS.

Circular No. 947, issued by the Department of Education of Louisiana is a letter proposing that each Parish in the State, select a farmer's son to make a journey through the middle West during the month of August. Mr. Norbert Lemaire handed the letter to us for publication, and it would be a splendid education for some of the young-men of Iberia. As many can take advantage of the trip as desire to go, providing of course that their expenses are paid, either by themselves or an interested party. In nearly all of the parishes of Louisiana, reservations have already been made, and those of our citizens who wish to avail their sons an opportunity to see the middle West could do nothing better than let them take advantage of the journey.

The communication reads as follows:

"I am very glad to be able to state that the proposed tour through certain of the agricultural sections of the middle west next August by a large delegation of Louisiana country boys is assured. Some time in the spring, Messrs. C. H. Staples and W. C. Abbott, of the University extension forces, will visit Iowa, Wisconsin, and Illinois for the purpose of selecting the places to be visited and making the necessary local arrangements for the handling of the party at each point visited. We are also assured by the railroad authorities that a special train will be provided, equipped with all needed facilities and comforts. Full details covering every phase of the tour will be published later.

"The purpose of this letter is to suggest and urge that you do what you can to see that your Parish is represented by two or more boys who would profit by the trip. The selection of the boys will be left to those interested in each parish, without any suggestions from me. The expenses will be about \$150.00. I think, for each boy. There will be found farmers in every parish who will be delighted to give their sons this vacation and to pay all of their expenses; there are public spirited men of means in every parish who will be glad to contribute from fifty to one hundred dollars each towards the expenses of two or more boys if the matter is brought to their attention; and there are public bodies in each parish which will be delighted to donate \$300.00 or more to defray the expenses of two or more country boys."

FOUR OIL WELLS SURPASS RECORDS.

Shreveport, La., Jan. 7.—All records in the history of light oil production went by the board Tuesday when the Claiborne field yielded four wells making initial production of more than 80,000 barrels a day. Included in the gushers is a new world wonder which made 40,000 on completion, according to the gauge. Another new well made 27,500 per day by the gauge, while a third came in with an estimated flow of 20,000 barrels.

Gilliland & Foster are the producers who got three of the wells, including the new world wonder. They started the day with bringing in their Jackson No. 5 in 21-21-7, making 700 barrels from the shallow sand at 1290 feet. They followed up this success with their Oakes No. 10 in 30-21-7, making 20,000 barrels from the deep sand at 258 feet. Then Galliland and Foster topped all records by completing their Shaw No. A-6 in 30-21-7, which came in with an initial production of 40,000 barrels.

The new gusher ran wild and the drillers were obliged to work all day to get it under control. It is the first instance on record where a well has resisted all efforts to control it for nearly twelve hours. The well marks the furthest southwest producer.

The Gulf Refining Company completed a perfect day by bringing in their Chatman No. 8 in 30-21-7, on the center of the south line of the section. The well was left open a few hours and then shut in as there was not sufficient tankage on hand to take care of the oil. During this time it gauged at 27,450 barrels per day. The production was found in the deep sand at 2000 feet.

Gulf Refining Company today posted advances on North Louisiana crudes, effective at 7 o'clock in the morning of date of notice, that advances are 25c on each barrel of crude. The new quotations follow: Caddo light, \$3; Caddo heavy, \$1.50; DeSoto \$2.90; Bull Bayou, \$2.65; Red River, \$2.50.

The Paris Temps of yesterday contained a dispatch from Constantinople to the effect that Mustapha Kemal, the Turkish Nationalist leader, is concentrating troops against the Greek front near Aidin and plans a general attack. The forces of the Greeks in this territory are said to number 70,000.

Mustapha Kemal is the leader of the faction which opposes the dismemberment of the Turkish Empire by the Paris Peace Conference.
