CHARTER OF Maximilian Planting Company, Inc.
United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of Iberia.

Be It Known, That on this 28th day of the month of February, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nineteen, before me, J. G. LeBlanc, a Notary Public in and for the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned:

Personally came and appeared, Messrs. J. E. Broussard, Raoul Broussard, Raoul Broussard, residents of the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, who declared and said that, desiring to avail themselves of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana with reference to the organization of corporations, they do hereby form themselves, and such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them, into a corporation and body politic for the object and purposes, and under the articles following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.
The name and title of this corporation shall be "MAXIMILIAN PLANTING COMPANY, (Incorporated)" and under its said corporate name, it shall have power and authority to contract, to sue and be sued, to make and use a corporate seal and same to break and alter at pleasure, to acquire by purchase or otherwise, hold, receive, purchase, mortgage, improve, sell, borrow, pledge, mortgage, name, property, real, personal and mixed to name and appoint such officers, directors, agents and managers or employees as may be desirable, to prescribe their duties and to fix their compensation if any, to make by-laws, rules and regulations for the management of its affairs, to conduct business in this State, to hold stock in other corporations, and to do all things necessary, proper and desirable, to carry out the objects and purposes of this corporation, unless sooner dissolved under the provisions of this charter, the said corporation shall exist and continue for a period of fifty years.

ARTICLE II.
The domicile shall be at Hulton Plantation, in the Third Ward of the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, the president, or in his absence the secretary-treasurer of this Corporation shall be the person upon whom the citation or other legal process may be served.

ARTICLE III.
The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of the business to be engaged in by it are hereby declared to be the owning, leasing, subleasing (either for money or other consideration) planting and cultivating the farm lands the buying, selling and otherwise disposing of all and every kind of crop or crops grown and raised on farm and agricultural lands, the advancing of money, funds and supplies to tenants or other individuals on their growing crops and produce, and generally to do all things necessary to the raising, growing, cultivating, buying, selling, lending money on and otherwise producing and handling of agricultural products.

ARTICLE IV.
The capital stock of said corporation shall be Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5000.00) divided into and represented by fifty

shares of the par value of One Hundred Dollars each, which said stock shall be paid for in cash at the time of its issuance.

Every sale or transfer of the capital stock of the corporation shall be made on the books of the company at its office, and on the surrender of the certificate therefor a new certificate shall issue to the proper holder thereof.

The capital stock of this corporation may be increased to Seventy Thousand Dollars, (\$70,000.00) in the manner provided by law.

This corporation shall commence doing business as soon as the capital stock thereof shall have been subscribed as required by law and by this charter and paid in.

The names and post office addresses of the subscribers of the articles of incorporation, and the number of shares each agrees to take are as follows:

J. E. Broussard, Loreauville P. O., Iberia Parish, La., 17 shares.
Raoul Broussard, Loreauville P. O., Iberia Parish, La., 17 shares.
Raoul Broussard, Loreauville P. O., Iberia Parish, La., 16 shares.

ARTICLE V.
The corporate powers of this corporation shall be exercised by a board of three directors who shall be stockholders in this corporation and who shall be elected by the stockholders annually at a general meeting to be held on the Second Tuesday of the month of December, and the said board shall have and is hereby vested with all the corporate powers of this corporation subject only to such restrictions as may be herein mentioned.

From the said directors, there shall be elected annually a President, a Vice President, and a Secretary-Treasurer of the said corporation. The following persons, each of whom are who each declare themselves to be bona-fide owners of at least one unpledged share of stock in this corporation, shall constitute the first Board of Directors, to-wit:

J. E. Broussard whose Post Office address is Loreauville, Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana; Raoul Broussard whose Post Office address is Loreauville, Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana; Raoul Broussard, whose Post Office address is Loreauville, Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana.

The said Board of Directors above named shall continue in office until their successors are elected, each board of directors at the first meeting after their election, shall elect officers for the corporation as herein above provided, who shall likewise hold office for one year.

The President of this corporation as hereby declared to be J. E. Broussard, of Loreauville P. O., Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana, its Vice President Raoul Broussard, whose post office address is Loreauville, Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana; and its Secretary-Treasurer, Raoul Broussard, whose post office address is Loreauville, Iberia Parish, State of Louisiana.

Notice of stockholders annual meeting must be delivered personally or by depositing the same in the Post Office properly addressed to each stockholder at least fifteen days before such meeting, other stockholders meetings may be held when ordered by the Board of Directors, or the holders of at least twenty-five per cent of the outstanding stock after notice as aforesaid.

The Board of Directors shall appoint a stockholder to act as commissioner of elections at board of directors, and in the event of the said commissioner failing to be present at the time fixed for a meeting, the President shall appoint another stockholder in his stead.

Failure from any cause to elect directors on the day named for the purpose, will not dissolve this corporation, but the directors in office, as well as the other officers of the company, shall hold over until their successors are chosen. In such event, the President shall cause another election to be held within thirty days and at a date and hour named by him, giving the notice to the stockholders as required by law.

At every election and meeting each stockholder shall be entitled to one vote for each share of capital stock of the corporation standing in his name, and he may vote such stock by written proxy given to any person to represent him at such meeting. The election of directors shall be by ballot and the majority of the amount of votes cast shall elect the person or persons for whom they have been cast.

ARTICLE VI.
The Board of Directors shall frame and adopt such by-laws and rules and regulations as the affairs and business for the conduct and management thereof, provided the same shall not conflict with this charter, appoint such agents, employees, servants, and clerks as it may deem proper—fixing their compensation and terms of service and dismiss them at pleasure. It shall have the right to fix and determine the salaries of the several officers and employees herein provided for. Any director may appoint another director or shareholder to act and vote for him on all matters coming before any meeting of the board.

ARTICLE VII.
No share holder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contract or debts of this corporation in any further sum than the amount of his indebtedness to the corporation, nor shall any mere informality in organization have the effect of rendering this act null or of exposing any share holder to any liability beyond the amount of his or her shares.

ARTICLE VIII.
This corporation shall have, enjoy and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities granted in Act 267 and acted by the general assembly of the State of Louisiana in the year 1914, and this charter may be changed, altered or annulled or the corporation dissolved under the terms and conditions and in accordance with said Act No. 267.

CHARTER OF THE Red Rose Colored Social Club.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Iberia.
Be It Known, That on this the 15th day of January, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, before me, Thomas T. Carey, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified, in and for the Parish and State aforesaid, and in the presence of the undersigned competent witnesses:

Personally came and appeared, the parties whose names are hereto subscribed who declared, that availing themselves of the provisions of the Statutes of the State of Louisiana, relative to the organization of corporations, they have covenanted, agreed, and do by these presents, covenant, agree and bind themselves, and those who may hereafter become associated with them to form themselves into and constitute a corporation, for the objects and purposes and under the stipulations following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.
The name and title of this corporation shall be THE RED ROSE COLORED SOCIAL CLUB, and its domicile shall be in the Parish of Iberia, Louisiana, in the City of New Iberia. Under its said corporate name it shall have the power to contract, sue and be sued; to make and use a corporate seal and the same break or alter at pleasure; to hold, receive, lease, purchase and convey, under its corporate name, property, real and personal; to name and appoint such officers and agents as the interests and convenience of said corporation may require; to make and establish such by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management and regulation of the affairs of said corporation as may be necessary and proper, and the same to change and alter at pleasure and to do all such things as are or may be necessary to properly carry out the objects and purposes of said corporation. And the said corporation unless sooner dissolved under the provisions of this Charter, or by authority of law, shall exist for a period of twenty-five years from the day of its incorporation in compliance with the law.

All citation or other legal process shall be served upon the President of said corporation, or in his absence or inability upon the Vice President thereof, or in case of the absence or inability of the Vice President, upon the Secretary.

ARTICLE II.
The objects and purposes of this corporation shall be the establishment in New Iberia, of a club-room, a library and reading room for the literary improvement of its members and the cultivation of friendly and social intercourse and for the carrying out of the objects and purposes of this corporation.

ARTICLE III.
The corporate powers of this association and the management of its affairs shall be vested in and exercised by five, (5) members composing the Board of Government. Said Board to consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, and two other members elected by ballot at an annual meeting of the members of this corporation to be held on the fifteenth day of January of each year, by a majority of members necessary to form a quorum as hereinafter established.

Alex Baptiste, Henry Coach, Ovide Baptiste, and Junius Baptiste have been chosen and selected to compose the First Board of Government, with the said Alex Baptiste as President, the said Henry Coach as Vice President, and the said Ovide Baptiste as Secretary-Treasurer, to serve until the annual meeting of the members of this corporation to be held on the fifteenth day of January, 1921, and until their successors are elected and installed.

ARTICLE IV.
The expenses incurred by this corporation incidental to the carrying out of the purposes of its organization, as well as the cost of maintaining its club-rooms shall be paid out of funds derived from such monthly dues as may be assessed against its members by its by-laws and out of the receipts from the amusements provided; and all sums so received shall be expended by the Board of Government for the object and purpose herein set forth by Article II of this Charter.

ARTICLE V.
Special meetings of the members of this corporation may be called by the President, or in his absence by any one of the officers named in Article three of this Charter, in the order of their naming, at their own discretion, but they shall do so upon the written request of five members.

ARTICLE VI.
A quorum for the ordinary transaction of business shall consist of fifteen of the members of this corporation.

ARTICLE VII.
No member of this corporation shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts or debts of this corporation in any further sum than the amount of his indebtedness to the Association; nor shall any mere informality in organization have the effect of rendering this act null, or of exposing a member to any liability beyond the amount of his indebtedness.

ARTICLE VIII.
This act of incorporation may be altered, amended and modified by a vote of a majority of all of the members of the Association at a special meeting called for that purpose.
