ASSESSORS' SALARY BILL INTRODUCED.


Baton Rouge, La., June 23.—A bill increasing the salaries of all assessors 10 per cent was introduced in the Senate Wednesday night by Senator Browne.

The bill is based on recommendations of the legislative investigating committee, which studied the status of salaries, and follows the introduction of bills several days ago giving sheriffs a pay raise of 20 per cent. The assessors' salary increase bill also materially increases the expense accounts of the assessors, the increase ranging from 20 per cent. to almost 100 per cent in some cases, notably Caddo parish.

The salaries of assessors as contemplated in the bill follow: Acadia \$3300; Iberia \$3000; Lafayette \$2750; St. Martin \$2475; St. Mary \$3300; Vermilion \$3300.
